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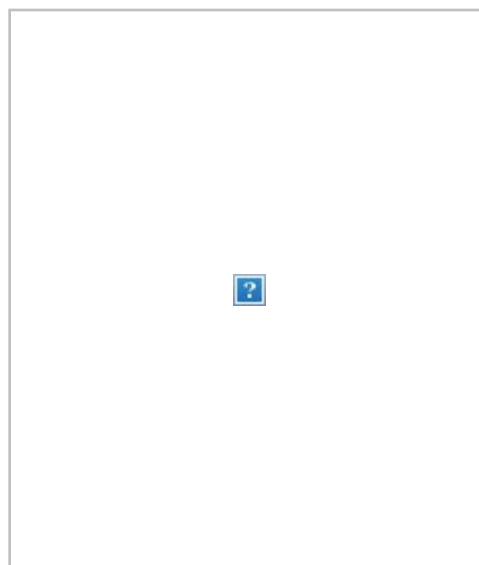

- 45 medical student citations

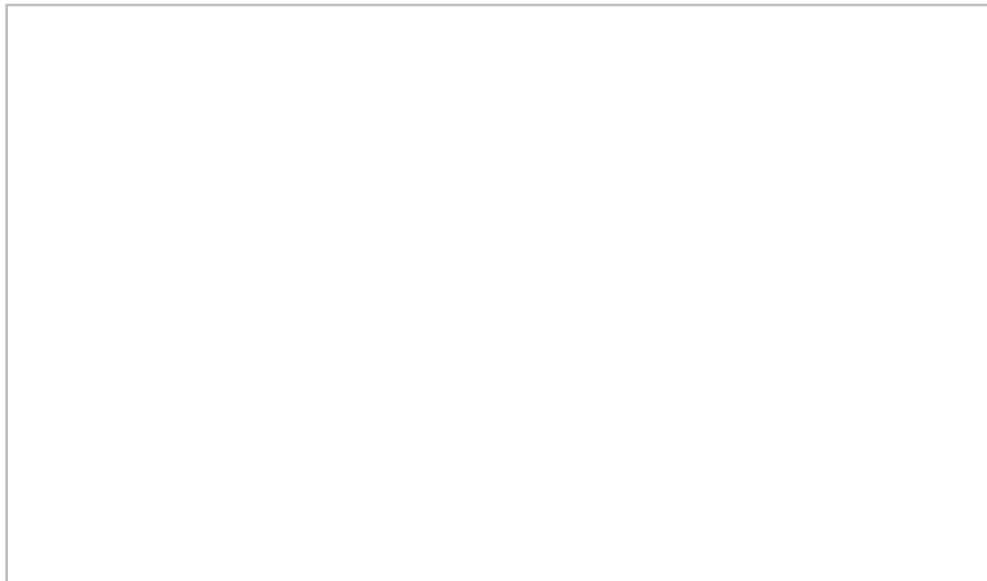

Resource of the Month: ClinicalKey

WHAT IS IT? The [ClinicalKey](#) database contains an enormous amount of content from Elsevier, one of the major STEM publishers, including more than 1,000 eBooks, nearly 700 full-text eJournals, drug information, procedural videos, and images. A number of OUWB's required and recommended course textbooks are available through ClinicalKey and are linked on the library's [Textbooks](#) web pages.

HOW DO I ACCESS IT? The link to ClinicalKey can be found on the library's [Databases](#) web page. Individual textbooks are also linked on the [Course and Clerkship Guides](#).



WHY BOTHER? This is one of the few interfaces that allows searching across different formats. Unlike PubMed which only searches journal articles, or AccessMedicine which only searches McGraw-Hill books, a ClinicalKey search retrieves books, book chapters, journal articles, videos and other materials, albeit only from one publisher. Other strengths include:

- Leading textbooks that are continuously updated as new editions are published. See the full list [here](#)
- The popular Procedures Consult series of videos illustrating common office and surgical procedures. See the full list [here](#)
- Drug information, including tools to run comparison, adverse reaction, and interaction reports
- CME credit for physicians
- Thousands of images that can be easily downloaded into PowerPoint presentations for teaching

TIPS & TRICKS! You must register (while on campus) for a free personal account in order to print PDF book chapters, download images, and claim CME credit.

IS THERE AN APP FOR THAT? Yes! Access the nearly complete ClinicalKey database (including all the books) from your handheld device! First create a free personal account on the main ClinicalKey web page. Then, download the free app from the App Store or Google Play. Activate the app with your personal account username and password.
