Merit award status is granted to chapters which complete between 34 and 45 activities, and honorable mention to chapters which have not completed the minimum number of activities required to receive a Merit or Superior Merit Award during the merit award cycle of April 1, 2007 to March 31, 2008.

The SHRM student chapter merit award program, which began in 1972, exists to develop more effective student chapters, and to promote outstanding activities and projects by student chapters in four areas: basic student chapter requirements, chapter programming and professional development of members, support of the human resource profession, and partnership with SHRM. The Student Chapter Name receives a specialized plaque to display at the university, and is being recognized in SHRM's publications and at its conferences.
