Use your benefits wisely - ER or Urgent Care?

It's 9 p.m. when your child comes down with a fever and you suspect an ear infection. In the past, you had two unappealing options: wait until the morning when the pediatrician's office opens or go to the emergency room.

However, there's another alternative for treatment of minor illnesses and injuries - urgent care facilities.

Not only will the co-pay be \$5 instead of \$25 for an emergency room visit, chances are your wait will be shorter.

Obtaining proper treatment is the most significant consideration in health care, but it's also important to be an educated consumer. Urgent care facilities fit the bill for many situations.

A trip to the ER is imperative for emergencies such as sudden loss of consciousness, severe bleeding, suspected heart attack or abdominal pain. However, urgent care facilities are ideal for people with minor problems that could worsen if not treated.

Located throughout the metro-Detroit area, these clinics are open during the evening and weekend hours when most physician offices are closed.

Visiting an urgent care facility instead of the ER is one of the ways employees can help control the skyrocketing cost of benefits. Inappropriate and excessive use of the emergency room, for non-emergencies or routine care, results in higher medical premiums through higher medical costs. An average emergency room visit is \$400 to \$1,000.
