1980 Outlook

Oakland University first-year soccer coach Klaas de Boer welcomes back 15 returning lettermen in search of the Pioneers' 12th consecutive winning season. De Boer came to Pioneerland from the Detroit Lightning, of the Major Indoor Soccer League, where he served as Director of Public Relations and Player Development. He also was the assistant coach with the Detroit Express of the North American Soccer League and head soccer coach at Cleveland State University from 1970-77.

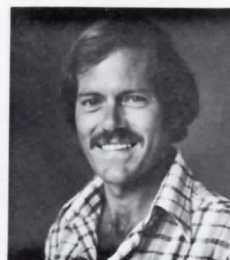
Sophomore midfielder Dandy Oskey (Flint/Carman) led the Pioneers to a 9-9-1 mark last fall. The fleet-footed Oskey led the team in scoring with nine points, tallying four goals and five assists. Seniors Tony Hermiz (Pleasant Ridge/Ferndale) and Joe Wilden (Utica/Eisenhower) and sophomore Kevin Kelly (St. Louis, Mo.) each scored six goals last year.

Also returning from the 1979 team are midfielders Bob Read (Birmingham/Groves), Craig Pickard (Livonia/Stevenson) and Dave Morgan (St. Louis, Mo.) and forwards Karim Hammou (Birmingham/Groves), Dave Wandeloski (Utica/Eisenhower), Dino Del Piccolo (Arvada, Colo.) and Martin Little (Troy/Seaholm). Little played 11 games in goal for the Pioneers, replacing the injured Tony Pietrantoni (Warren/Cousino), who also returns for the 1980 campaign.

Little will be moved back to his natural forward spot this year, after a 5-5-1 record in goal last fall. A healthy Pietrantoni and new recruit Mark Hamilton, an All-American junior college goaltender at Macomb Community College last year, will battle for the starting nod.

De Boer also recruited seven other players including forwards Morris Lupenec and Russ Gans, defenseman Jeff Whiteside and midfielders Dan Fitzgerald, Randy Karjewski, Barry Vince and Steve Mastrogianis. Lupenec and Fitzgerald are potential starters.

Klaas de Boer



Klaas de Boer enters his first season as head coach of the Oakland University soccer squad this year.

The 38-year-old head coach was the former director of player development and public relations with the Detroit Lightning of the Major Indoor Soccer League. He was also assistant coach and the director of scouting and player development for the Detroit Express of the North American Soccer League. A holder of the United States Soccer Federation's "A" coaching license, de Boer graduated from Michigan State University in 1965. A three-year starter for the Spartan squad, de Boer led his team to an NCAA finalist spot in 1964.

De Boer coached from 1972-78 at Cleveland State University. He was named the 1977 Ohio, Midwest, and National Collegiate Coach of the Year by the National Soccer Coaches Association. His 1977 squad was ranked fourth nationally before losing in the quarterfinals of the NCAA tournament to Southern Illinois University in three overtimes. While at Cleveland University, de Boer coached four All-Americans, 15 All-Midwest choices and 24 All-Ohio selections. His 1975 team travelled to Brazil for a preseason trip and was ranked nineteenth nationally. He also had three teams participate in the NCAA Division I tournament. His six-year record at CSU was 55-25-2.

De Boer, his wife and two children, live in Oxford.

Tony Pietrantonì, G, 5-8, 155, So.

Had a 3-4 record in his freshman year... Posted victories against Ohio University, a 2-1 overtime decision, and shutouts against Spring Arbor College (1-0) and Kalamazoo College (4-0)... Missed most of the season with a knee injury but has fully recovered and is looking for a healthy 1980 season.

Jim Rennie, D, 5-8, 140, So.

Hard working defender... Very underrated player... Controls the ball very well... Very deceptive player, who uses his size and quickness to his advantage... Had only five shots on goal last year and was called for 15 fouls.

Kevin Kelly, D, 5-11, 160, So.

Saw action in 17 games last year... Led the team with six goals... Had two goals against Central Michigan University and Bowling Green State University... Added single tallies against Lewis University and Kalamazoo College... Had 44 shots on goal, fourth best on the team... Had a team high of 60 fouls.

Bob Read, M, 6-2, 170, Jr.

Had two goals and one assist last fall... Played in 16 games... Had one goal and one assist against the University of Dayton... Also had one goal against Kalamazoo College... Biggest player on the team... Defends extremely well... Aggressive player... Good player "in the air".

Larry Field, F, 5-7, 145, So.

Second leading scorer on last year's team with eight points, all assists... Played in 16 games and had 37 shots on goal, while collecting 14 fouls... Had four assists against the University of Dayton in the Pioneers' 6-1 triumph.

Karim Hammou, F, 5-6, 135, Sr.

Had three points last year with one goal and two assists... Scored lone goal against the University of Michigan while picking up assists against Central Michigan University and Grace College... Had 24 shots on goal and 30 fouls... Two-year, all-state performer from Birmingham Groves High School... Nicknamed "Frenchy"... Excellent ball handler... Extremely tough in close situations.



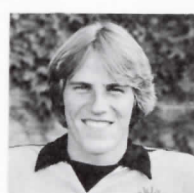

Player Profiles

Tony Hermiz, F, 6-0, 150, Sr.

Played in every game for the Pioneers last season... Third leading scorer with seven points, including six goals and one assist... Scored goals against Ohio University, the University of Dayton, Grace College, St. Clair College, Bowling Green State University and Kalamazoo College... Goal against Ohio University was a game winner... Had lone assist against Spring Arbor College... Had 45 shots on goal, third-best on the squad... Had 10 goals and nine assists two years ago in 15 games... Outstanding ability to control ball... Possibly the best player on the team.

Martin Little, F, 6-0, 160, Jr.

Filled in at the goalie position after starting goalkeeper Tony Pietrantonì was sidelined with a knee injury... Recorded a 5-5-1 record, while making 61 saves... Will return to his natural forward position this year... Scored two goals last year... Tallied against Ohio University in the Pioneers' 2-1 triumph and in the season finale against Kalamazoo College... Scored nine goals and had two assists two years ago... Very quick and fast player.

Craig Pickard, M, 6-0, 160, Jr.

Big, strong midfielder, who is noted for his good throw-ins... Saw action in 15 games last year and had one assist against Bowling Green State University... Scored three goals and two assists as a freshman... Played on Livonia Stevenson High School's championship team... Credits his father as having the biggest influence in his athletic career... Son of Mr. and Mrs. James Pickard.

Dino Del Piccolo, F, 6-0, 160, So.

Saw limited action last year appearing in 12 games... Should supply the Pioneers with excellent depth on the front line... Had only six shots on goal and four fouls last season.

Dave Wandeloski, F, 5-10, 165, Sr.

Played in every game last year for the Pioneers... Scored two goals and three assists... Scored both goals against the University of Dayton... Nicknamed the "Tasmania Devil" by his teammates...

Strong, hard working player, who is always looking for ways to improve his game... Scored three goals and had five assists as a sophomore... Older brother, Stan, also played OU soccer.

Dave Morgan, M, 6-0, 170, So.

Played in 17 games as a freshman... Scored his lone goal in his rookie season against Grace College in OU's 3-0 victory... Had 26 shots on goal and accumulated 11 fouls... Good defender, who works very hard at his game.

Joe Wilden, M, 6-2, 175, Sr.

Scored six goals last year to tie for fourth place on the season scoring charts... Scored OU's lone goal against Cleveland State University, Michigan State University and Marquette University... Also tallied against the University of Dayton, St. Clair College and Grace College... Goal against Michigan State was the game winner for the Pioneers... Had 46 shots on goal, second highest on the squad... Has the ability to control the tempo of the game... Look for great things from him in his senior season.

Dandy Oskey, M, 5-8, 150, So.

Leading scorer on last year's team with nine points... Scored four goals and added five assists... Led the squad with 61 shots on goal... Also had 47 fouls, second highest on the team behind Kevin Kelly's 60... Exciting player to watch... Scored game winning goal against Spring Arbor College... Also scored against the University of Dayton and twice against St. Clair College... Had one assist against Dayton, Michigan State University, Grace College, Bowling Green State University and Kalamazoo College... Expect great things from him this year.

Mark Christensen, F, 5-9, 160, Sr.

Sat out last year but hopes to return to his 1978 form when he led the team in scoring with 20 points in 15 games... Scored 14 goals and added six assists... Can also play midfielder... Scored three goals and tallied six assists three seasons ago... Only athlete in OU history to participate in NCAA post season tournament in two sports, soccer and wrestling, Hard working player with proven scoring ability.
