THREE CONTRACTS NOW READY FOR BOARD ACTION

The OU Board of Trustees will consider three contracts during its Wednesday, Aug. 15 meeting. Ratification by the three bargaining units will be completed prior to the board's 8:30 p.m. meeting in the Gold Room of the Oakland Center.

Contracts to be ratified by the board include three-year agreements with the Police Officers Association, and the OU local of the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, and a one-year contract with the Clerical-Technical Association. The police unit represents 12 officers while there are 155 AFSCME members and 226 members of the CT bargaining unit.

The Police Officers Association ratified its contract on July 31, the AFSCME members met Friday, Aug. 10, to consider their contract, and the Clerical-Technical Association will meet at noon on Wednesday, Aug. 15, to consider its new contract.

A decision by arbitrator Charles Rehmus will be received Tuesday, Aug. 14. Rehmus is considering unsettled issues in a proposed contract between OU and its chapter of the American Association of University Professors.

MEADOW BROOK SLATES EXCITING FINAL WEEK

The final week of the Meadow Brook Music Festival brings five exciting personalities to the pavilion stage. They are pianist Philippe Entremont, conductor Hiroyuki Iwaki, troubadour John Sebastian, jazz clarinetist Pete Fountain, and

musician-comedian Victor Borge.

John Sebastian, founder and lead singer of the Lovin' Spoonful of the 60's, will be featured Wednesday, Aug. 15.

Noted French pianist Philippe Entremont will appear in concert Thursday, Aug. 16, and Saturday, Aug. 18, with guest conductor Hiroyuki Iwaki. Entremont is a four-time winner of France's highest record honor, the Grand Prix de Disque. Iwaki is internationally known and is currently chief conductor of the Hague Philharmonic.

In his two appearances, Entremont will play Ravel's Piano Concerto for the Left Hand and the Saint-Saens Second Piano Concerto. A highlight of the Thursday, Aug. 16 program will be Iwaki's conducting of "Kyo-so" by Japanese composer Ishii. The work is receiving its Meadow Brook premiere. Clarinet virtuoso Pete Fountain returns by popular demand on Friday, Aug. 17, following his sell-out performance of last season. He developed his jazz style and technique playing in various Bourbon Street clubs.

Victor Borge will conclude the season with his versatile program of music and comedy on Sunday, Aug. 19. Borge has broken box office records on Broadway and he is a radio and television star as well. Appearing with him will be Marylyn Mulvey.

OU officials are withholding comment on the opinion until they can receive a copy of it and are able to present it to the Board of Trustees for study. OU in the past has declined to release individual salaries of employees as a matter of board policy.

MATHEMATICS FACULTY ACTIVE IN WRITING FIELD

Three members of OU's Department of Mathematics have been active recently in writing and teaching in summer institutes.

They are: Irwin Schochetman whose paper entitled "Compact and Hilbert-Schmidt Induced Representations," has been accepted for publication in the Duke University Mathematics Journal; and Yel-Chiang Wu and Peter Hilton who are the co-authors of a new book, A Course in Modern Algebra, now under production by John Wiley, Inc. In addition, Wu taught at a recent National Science Foundation Institute for college teachers held at Colgate University.

DEAN PIERSON ATTENDS EOP TRAINING INSTITUTE

Manuel Pierson, dean of Student Services, was among those participating in a two-week training institute for Equality-of-Opportunity (EOP) administrators held at the University of Iowa.

The institute that began July 29 was designed to develop greater understanding of the structure and function of higher education and to further develop administrative skills for EOP administrators in 15 midwestern colleges and universities.

PROVIDENCE HOSPITAL NURSES TO STUDY HERE THIS FALL

Approximately 300 nurses from Providence Hospital will begin taking their general education and science courses at OU this fall as they complete their first or second years in the hospital's two-year diploma program.

Providence Hospital and university officials are completing plans for a four-year baccalaureate program to be offered at OU with practical training at Providence. The university's Board of Trustees at a July 25 meeting unanimously approved a resolution concerning the nursing program. It stated, "Resolved, that the Oakland University Board of Trustees hereby encourages the continued planning by the university regarding a bachelor of science in nursing program with the aim of implementation in the 1974 fall semester."
