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# OU professor's research paper recognized

The research paper of Oakland University Assistant Professor of Biomedical Sciences Shravan Chintala recently was recognized as one of the top 10 percent of glaucoma research literature published in 2001 by the "International Glaucoma Review" (IGR).

"I am very proud to read about professor Chintala's work, its importance and impact on science vision research," said Virinder Moudgil, interim vice president for Academic Affairs and provost. "His suggestion that common mechanisms contribute to the pathophysiology of the glaucomas and of vascular diseases is of fundamental importance."

Chintala coauthored the "Activation of a tissue-specific stress response in the Aqueous outflow pathways of the eye defines the glaucoma disease phenotype" paper with N. Wang, M. E. Fini and J. S. Schumann. It appeared in "Nature Medicine."

The IGR is a journal for members of all international glaucoma societies. The IGR publishes papers on glaucoma and selects about 10 percent of them for special comments in the "Editors Selection." The selection for this section means the editorial board considers a paper of special importance for the readership.
