OU and City of Rochester announce partnership

Oakland University and the **City of Rochester** announced a formal agreement to partner on a variety of reciprocal business and academic ventures during an official signing in downtown Rochester on Oct. 15. Oakland University President Gary D. Russi and Rochester Mayor Karen Lewis both signed the agreement and discussed details.

"We are excited to have this partnership with Oakland University," said Lewis. "The Institution has played a vital role in our community for the past 46 years. Rochester has a vibrant downtown, with nearly 400 businesses, and we are confident it will become an even greater destination place for OU students, alumni, faculty and staff."

Rochester merchants and businesses will partner with OU students and faculty in joint educational and cultural programming such as employment, internships, research and development projects, business development assistance, community service projects and opportunities to showcase the arts, theatre and music to complement their classroom work.

"This partnership is linked directly to OU's mission to provide a unique and distinctive educational experience," Russi said. "This agreement will increase opportunities for our students to be involved in class projects and hands-on training with businesses in downtown Rochester and provide them with practical experience as they enter the workforce."
