While it is probably true that too many students do expect country club cooking for their less than two dollar per day meal allotment it seems to this paper that we at least deserve a little better dinner than a mass of leftover beef scraps in a sticky brown goo called optimistically "beef stroganoff" or an indigestible mass of dough stuck atop several drab slices of what was labeled sliced turkey. If this type of fare was exceptional we would not have any reason to really complain. However, such dreary meals are definitely becoming more frequent.

Not only does meal quality seem to be on the decline at the Sunset Room but the size of helpings seem to us to be dwindling. While vegetables cooked in clear water are not terribly tasty they certainly can fill hungry stomachs. However, the size of most vegetable portions seem to have gotten smaller since last year.

Finally, a number of residents find that the replacing of fruit juice with non-bicarbonated artificial drinks is less than satisfactory. While the amount of natural fruit juice was small it cannot be replaced by any amount of sweetened colored water.

As we said above we do not expect luxury cooking but we do feel that with a little more attention to preparation and quantity many complaints could be easily avoided.
