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SWIM CLUB MEMBERSHIPS DUE IN THIS WEEK

Applications for membership in the OU Swim Club on the Meadow Brook estate, open to all full-time employees of the University, should be returned to the club committee by noon Friday, chairman W.W. Kent has announced. The forms are to be returned to his office at 282 Hannah Hall. The 12-week season, the third for the club, will run from this Sunday through the Labor Day weekend, September 7.

Membership fees for the entire season run \$30 for singles, \$50 for couples, and \$75 for families. Partial season memberships are being offered at respective rates of \$12, \$20 and \$30 for four weeks and \$24, \$40 and \$60 for eight weeks. Daily hours throughout the summer will be 1 to 8 p.m. on Saturdays and noon to 8 p.m. on Sundays. MBT ANNOUNCES PLAYS

Meadow Brook Theatre has announced the eight plays that will be performed during the 1970-71 season at OU and at the Detroit Institute of Arts. The theatre will open its fifth season on Thursday, October 8, with the world premiere of *Requiem*, a new play by American playwright Kevin O'Morrison. The schedule also includes: *The Rainmaker* by Richard Nash, Nov. 5; *The Glass Menagerie* by Tennessee Williams, Dec. 3; *The Rehearsal*, by Jean Anouilh, Jan. 7; *The Killing of Sister George* by Frank Marcus, Feb. 4; *The Caretaker* by Harold Pinter, March 4; *The Knack* by Ann Jellicoe, April 1; and *A Moon for the Misbegotten* by Eugene O'Neill, April 29.

OU HOSTS COUNTY-WIDE CONFERENCE ON PLANNING

Several members of the OU community will participate in the fifth biennial conference of the Oakland County Planning Commission, which will be held Thursday in the Oakland Center. More than 500 are expected to attend the all-day program. They will include representatives of city councils, townships boards, planning commissions, zoning boards of appeal, builders, architects and engineers, mortgage houses, realtors, developers, chambers of commerce, and industrial boards.

Chancellor O'Dowd will welcome the conference delegates to campus, after which official opening remarks will be given by Robert F. Patnales, chairman of the Oakland County Board of Commissioners, and Elmer B. Cooper, OU assistant chancellor for urban affairs and chairman of the Oakland County Human Relations Agency. Paul Tombulian, professor of chemistry and head of the OU chemistry department, will serve on a panel discussing "Saving the Countryside." Three OU students who will serve on various panels are Allen L. Chamberlin, Ronald Tidrow and Sue Lynn Weaver.

PLANNING MONEY ASKED

Planning funds in the amount of \$25,000 for the OU public safety and services building are provided in the capital outlay bill for higher education now pending in the House. George Karas (physical plant) said the architect is being asked to draw up the design and specifications so that construction could begin early in 1971, if state authorization and funds could be obtained during this fiscal year. The building will be located on the present site of the Belgian barns housing the grounds and landscaping department. The \$1,000,000 building will provide space for the department of public safety, to be expanded to include fire-fighting vehicles and personnel; stores, inventory, shipping and receiving, motor pool and audio-visual offices of the university services department, and structural maintenance and mechanical maintenance shops and some offices of the physical plant department.

CE DOES IT AGAIN!

Michigan's first university-sponsored adult education curriculum in computer sciences will be introduced in the Continuing Education evening program this fall. The new curriculum, titled "Concentration in Computing Sciences" offers three major options focusing on the main programming needs in the computer field. It has been developed by Edward Van Slambrouck, senior computing specialist, and an advisory committee made up of representatives of both industry and higher education.
