OU engineering professors receive grants

Four Oakland University professors from the School of Engineering and Computer Science were awarded grants to continue their research.

Professor Robert Loh received an award of \$169,980 from Daimler Chrysler Corp. for his research on "Speed Control Systems."

Professor Brian Sangeorzan was recognized by FEV Engine Technology Inc. for his research, "Motoring Engine Friction Study." This award is presently for \$60,000 through Sept. 30 and renewable for \$90,000 per year thereafter.

Professor Andrew Rusek was awarded \$37,500 from Daimler Chrysler Corp. for "Development of Models, Simulations, and Tests for the CAN Data Communication Busses, Phase I."

Professor Gautam B. Singh received a \$12,246 award for "Ergonomic Evaluations of New Pilot Builds" from Daimler Chrysler Corp.
