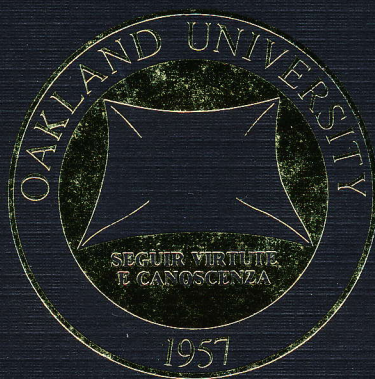

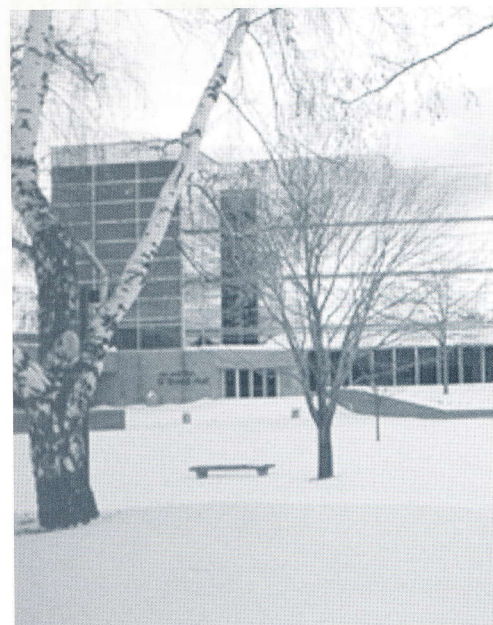

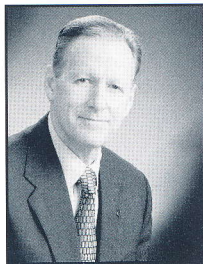

Message from the President

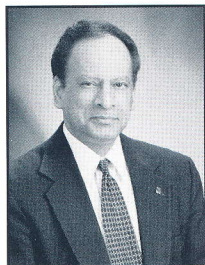

ABOUT OAKLAND UNIVERSITY

Oakland University was created in 1957, when the late Alfred and Matilda Wilson donated their 1,500-acre estate and \$2 million to Michigan State University to begin a new college in Oakland County.

Named Michigan State University-Oakland, the new campus enrolled its first 570 students in 1959. In 1963, its name changed to Oakland University as the first class graduated with 125 students receiving diplomas. In 1970, the Michigan Legislature recognized the maturity and stature of the university by granting it autonomy and the governor appointed Oakland University's first board of trustees.

From its beginnings, the university has emphasized academic quality, concentrating on providing a dynamic, student-focused learning environment with integration of liberal and professional studies by a faculty of dedicated scholar-teachers. The natural beauty of the campus, much of it still wooded and undeveloped, is enhanced by comprehensive recreational facilities and modern buildings that house the university's many academic and public service programs as well as nearly 1,800 residential students.

Dedicated to preparing learners for the new workplace and society, the university is organized into six academic units: The College of Arts and Sciences; and the Schools of Business Administration, Education and Human Services, Engineering and Computer Science, Health Sciences, and Nursing; and the Honors College.

Oakland has 112 bachelors degree programs and 72 graduate degree and certificate programs. Doctorates are offered in education; biomedical sciences (with specializations in medical physics, and health and environmental chemistry); reading, systems engineering, physical therapy; and applied mathematical sciences.

The university is continuously adapting to meet the changing needs of students and the marketplace. New programs, delivered online and on campus, include master's degree programs in nursing, biology, training and development, software engineering, an Executive MBA program in health care management and innovative Honors College courses. Business and industry partnerships provide unprecedented opportunities for advanced, hands-on learning.

Now, more than 16,000 students attend classes at Oakland University each year and the number of OU Alumni has increased to more than 60,000 people.

MISSION

Oakland University has a four-fold mission. It offers instructional programs of high quality that lead to degrees at the baccalaureate, master's and doctoral levels as well as programs in continuing education; it advances knowledge and promotes the arts, through research, scholarship and creative activity; it renders significant public service; and it facilitates student development. In all its activities, the university strives to exemplify educational leadership.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

An edifying note contributed by a certain anonymous doctor of philosophy.

On at least two solemn occasions during the academic calendar-spring and fall commencement-the faculty of the university publicly displays its full academic regalia and participates in the liturgy of processional and recessional, that curious coming and going that symbolizes the ceremony of commencement. The purposes of commencement are well known, but the reasons for the peculiar garb of the celebrants and their odd order of march are often as obscure to the audience as they are, in fact, to the faculty itself. This note may serve to explain academic dress and the professional pecking order it costumes.

Contemporary academics are descendants of clerical schoolmen in the universities of medieval Europe. Like the clergy, members of the bench and bar, and other learned professions, medieval scholars were clothed in heavy robes to stay warm in unheated stone buildings. Like all members of a hierarchical society, the medieval faculties rejoiced in visible insignia of rank. These outward signs of accomplishment and authority were tailored into robes. Although the need for such voluminous garments to keep the scholar from freezing is long past, the use of them as emblems of dignity remains. You will observe that all caps and gowns worn by our faculty are black, with certain disturbing exceptions. Black was the color adopted by mutual agreement among American universities at the end of the 19th century. In Europe, each university has its own distinctive gown, varying in color and cut from all others. A European academic assemblage is a far gaudier occasion than its counterpart in America. Recently, certain universities in this country rashly broke the agreement and authorized robes in their own colors: for example, the crimson of Harvard and green of Dartmouth may be seen in our ranks. This unsuitable spontaneity has been frowned on by sister institutions, yet the mavericks not only persist in their madness, but gain adherents to their ranks with each passing year.

There are three basic academic degrees: the baccalaureate or bachelor's degree, the master's degree, and the doctorate. A special style of robe is prescribed for each. The bachelor's gown is sparsely cut, neat, but a bit skimpy and unadorned, as befits apprentices. The master's gown is still simple, but fuller, sports a sleeve of extraordinary design impossible to describe, and has a hood draped from the shoulders down the back. Once used to keep the frost from the tonsured heads of medieval clerks, the hood is solely a badge of a

degree of scholarly achievement. The master's hood is small and narrow, but displays the colors of the institution that awarded the degree. If you knew the colors of American universities, you could easily identify whence came our masters. The doctoral robe is the most handsome of academic raiment. Generous of cut, of fine aristocratic stuff, it is faced with velvet chevrons on the ample sleeves. You will note that most of the velvet facings and chevrons are black, but that some are of other colors. According to personal taste, the doctor may display the color of his or her doctoral degree on the sleeves and facings: light blue for education, pink for music, apricot for nursing, orange for engineering, and many more. The royal blue of the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) is the most commonly seen in liberal arts institutions such as Oakland. The doctor's hood is the most elegant of all academic appurtenances. Large and graceful, it is lined in satin with the colors of the university that awarded the degree and is bordered with the color of the degree itself. Most academic costumes include the square cap called a mortarboard; the doctor's tassel may be either black or gold - tassels of all other degrees are black and stringy.

To instructed eyes, the order of march in the processional and recessional reveals the standing of individuals in the institution's formal hierarchy. In the processional the order of entrance into the hall is, quite fittingly, from most junior to most senior. The baccalaureate candidates enter first, followed successively by the masters and doctoral candidates with the whole separated from the faculty by a decent interval. In the faculty order, the instructors precede the assistant professors that in turn are followed by the associate professors. The august full professors bring up the rear. After a respectful distance come the deans who in turn are separated by a significant space from the awful majesty of the platform party, the vice president, the president, and the members of the board of trustees. All remain standing until the board is seated. After the ceremony, the order of recessional is the reverse of the processional. The greatest dignitaries stream out first, with the artfully organized ranks of priority wallowing in their wake.

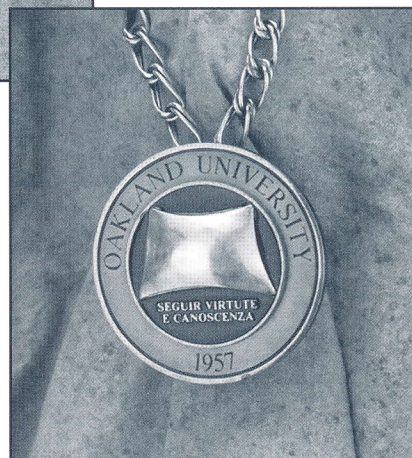
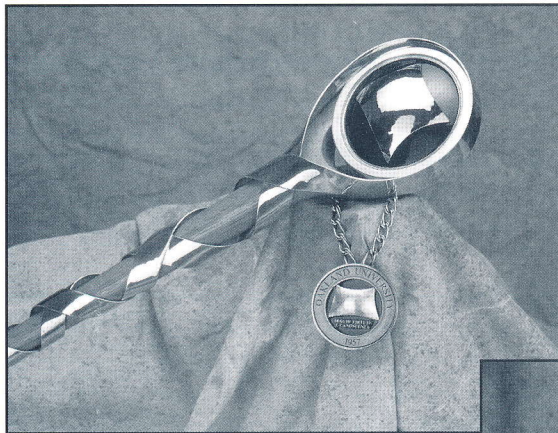
It is hoped that these notes may make more intelligible the spectacle you are witnessing today. A discerning intelligence may detect in it many clues to an understanding of the academic profession as it confronts the ambiguities of the future with ancient wisdom and dignified confidence.

THE MACE AND PRESIDENT'S MEDALLION

In medieval times, a Mace was used in warfare. The Mace is one of the oldest traditions in academe dating back to the early 1400's when it transitioned from warfare to ceremonial use. Considered a symbol of the university itself, the scepter Mace is carried by the university marshal during commencement, convocation and other ceremonial events to signify the arrival of the faculty processional. Oakland's Mace, created in 1994, was crafted by jeweler and OU alumnus, Paul Haig and designer Robert Dobbie of P.R. Haig Jewelers in Rochester.

The 30-inch long, approximately 8-pound mace has a white oak handle trimmed with sterling silver ribbon. A black obsidian disk on top is ringed with silver and is inscribed with the university motto. Obsidian is a natural black glass formed by the earth. On each side of the obsidian disk, there is a 14k yellow gold sail. On the base of the handle, a gold oak tree was modeled after a live tree on campus. The clean, straightforward design of the mace reflects the fact that Oakland University is a contemporary institution.

The President's Medallion, also created in 1994 by the same jeweler, is six inches in diameter and reveals the university sail, hangs on a silver chain and is worn by the President at ceremonial events. It is a permanent part of the university's president's academic regalia.

Eugene A. Miller

Doctor of Humanities

Eugene A. Miller has had a distinguished career in banking, culminating in an eight-year term as Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Comerica Bank, one of the nation's largest and most profitable banking companies and a member of the Fortune 500. His leadership skill is evident in the bank's consistent pattern of growth and profitability through every business cycle.

In his various leadership roles he has successfully managed this growth, including the merger of two very different banks into a cohesive unit reaching from California, Texas, and Florida to its Detroit home. The company's commitment to the prosperity of its hometown is reflected in its purchase of naming rights to Comerica Park.

Mr. Miller has served the business community through service as Vice President of the Federal Advisory Council of the Federal Reserve System Board of Governors, Chairman of the Association of Bank Holding Companies, Chairman of the Detroit Medical Center, Chairman of Concerned Citizens for the Arts in Michigan, and Chairman of the Economic Club of Detroit.

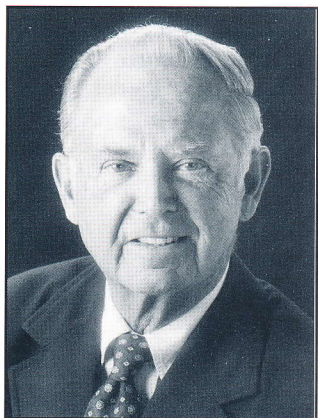
Mr. Miller has also shown a zest for leadership in public service as Chairman of the Detroit Renaissance, the Japan America Society, the Cranbrook Educational Community, the United Way, and the Oakland University Foundation Board of Directors.

Previous honors have included the Max M. Fisher Community Service Award, the Newsmaker of the Year Award from *Crain's Detroit Business*, Executive of the Year from the Detroit Executive's Association, Banker of the Year from the Michigan Banker's Association, and the Great American Traditions Award from B'nai B'rith International.

Mr. Miller earned a bachelor of business administration degree with honors from the Detroit Institute of Technology.

William G. Milliken

Doctor of Laws

William G. Milliken is the longest serving governor in Michigan history (1969-82). He also served as Lieutenant Governor (1965-69) and was a member of the State Senate (1961-64). When he entered the Senate, Oakland University was in its second year and had 908 enrolled students. When he completed his term as Governor, Oakland University had nearly 12,000 students, had gained its independence from Michigan State University, and had launched a full range of educational programs.

Governor Milliken appointed all eight of the original members of the Board of Trustees and established a pattern of appointing distinguished individuals without political patronage. His deep commitment to the principles of effective government and his recognition of the limits of government and the corresponding power of public service and commitment have been widely recognized and admired.

His years as the State's chief executive were characterized by successful management of a number of crises, including the worst economic downturn since the depression, automobile industry strikes, foreign oil embargoes, and the contamination of the food chain by PBB. His accomplishments include the introduction of revenue sharing to help Detroit, passage of the Environmental Protection Act of 1970, and reforms in unemployment compensation and transportation policy.

His years as an ex-Governor have been characterized by an energetic commitment to many public issues, especially environmental protection. He served on the Board of the Chrysler Corporation and chaired the Center for the Great Lakes. The wisdom and good will accumulated over many years of public service confer authority and dignity on his continued engagement in vital questions of public policy.

A graduate of Yale, Governor Milliken served in World War II as a waist-gunner and received the Purple Heart for participation in 50 combat missions.

Students who have earned University Honors wear a gold cord over their academic regalia.

Each student who has a record of superior achievement in a major field of study is awarded departmental honors and is identified by a red cord worn over academic regalia.

Conciliar Honors are awarded by the Faculty Council for General Studies to outstanding graduates of the General Studies program, who are identified by a red cord worn over academic regalia.

NATIONAL HONORS ORGANIZATIONS

An orange cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Beta Alpha Psi, the national scholastic and professional accounting society.

A green cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Beta Gamma Sigma, the honor society for schools of business administration accredited by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business.

A purple cord with white tassels worn over academic regalia indicates membership in the Golden Key International Honour Society.

A madonna red and blue cord with multicolored tassels indicates membership in Phi Alpha Theta, the international honor society in history.

Graduates of the Master of Public Administration Program who earned membership in Pi Alpha Alpha, the national honor society of public affairs and administration, wear a gold medallion attached to a gold and peacock blue ribbon.

A double gold cord with royal blue and gold tassels worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Psi Chi, the National Honor Society in Psychology.

A brown cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Tau Beta Pi, the National Engineering Honor Society.

A royal blue cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Eta Kappa Nu, the National Electrical Engineering Honor Society.

Membership in Sigma Theta Tau, the International Honor Society of Nursing, is indicated by a lavender cord worn over academic regalia.
