ABOUT OU

In 1957, the late Alfred G. and Matilda R. Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,500-acre Meadow Brook estate to Michigan State University to establish a college in Oakland County.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 as a branch campus of MSU, with 570 first-year students. By the mid-1960s, it had evolved into a medium-sized university and in 1970 became an independent, state-assisted university. It now offers more than 70 undergraduate programs and more than 30 graduate programs, and enrolls about 12,000 students.

OU's distinct instructional programs — the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Economics and Management, School of Engineering and Computer Science, School of Health Sciences, School of Human and Educational Services and School of Nursing — offer a diverse curricula of general education and career preparation courses. Virtually all of these courses are taught by faculty members, not teaching assistants.

The Honors College, a division of the College of Arts and Sciences, meets the educational needs of highly motivated students; the Division of Continuing Education meets the needs of nontraditional adult learners through evening and extension programs.

Academic support facilities include such notable entities as the Eye Research Institute, the only major eye research center in the United States not affiliated with a medical school; the Meadow Brook Health Enhancement Center, which provides health maintenance/health improvement and cardiac rehabilitation community outreach programs; and the Center for Robotics and Advanced Automation, a unit of the School of Engineering and Computer Science that utilizes high technology manufacturing methods.

And, OU's professional arts programs annually attract thousands to the campus. OU has received national recognition and local kudos for its Meadow Brook Theatre, Meadow Brook Art Gallery, Meadow Brook Hall and Meadow Brook Music Festival, the summer home of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

OU is located 25 miles north of Detroit, in the small town of Rochester. OU's modern campus, which houses the university's many academic and public service programs, is located on a beautifully wooded site, much of it still undeveloped.

Dr. PAUL HARTMAN

Athletic Director



Dr. Paul Hartman is in his third year as director of athletics at Oakland University. Hartman, only the third director in OU's athletic history, has instituted some innovative changes since arriving in Rochester.

Hartman added personnel, developed additional summer youth camps and offered a new season ticket plan in his first year. He also instituted a Hall of Honor for exceptional Pioneer athletes and introduced the first

athletic team banquet.

A veteran administrator in college athletics at several levels, Hartman served at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point for seven years prior to coming to OU. He also served in similar positions at Florida International University and Plymouth State College in New Hampshire.

Hartman succeeded Cory Van Fleet in June, 1983. The only other department director was the founding father of OU's athletic program, Holly Lepley.

RON FORBES

Business Manager

Entering his 16th year at OU is Ron Forbes, who serves as business manager for the athletic department. A graduate of Western Michigan University and a native of Royal Oak, Forbes also handles ticket distribution and receipts for the Pioneers.

ANDY GLANTZMAN

Sports Information Director

New to the Pioneer athletic department is Andy Glantzman, who replaced Stan Blackford as sports information director in August. Glantzman came to OU from the University of Detroit, where he worked in sports information for six years, three as assistant SID. The Brooklyn, New York, native earned a Bachelor of Science degree from St. John's University and a Master in Business Administration at U-D.

TOM VanVOORHIS

Marketing and Promotions

Tom VanVoorhis handles marketing and promotions for the athletic department. Among VanVoorhis' duties are selling advertising for Pioneer publications, arranging special game and sports camps promotions and scheduling speaking engagements for the coaching staff. The retired General Motors public relations and marketing employee is a graduate of the University of Michigan.

SANDY JORDAN

Head Athletic Trainer

Sandy Jordan is beginning her third year as head athletic trainer at OU. Jordan came to OU from the University of Detroit, where she spent a year as assistant trainer. The native of Rochester, New York, spent four years as a student assistant at Lock Haven State College while earning a Bachelor of Science degree in health and physical education with a specialization in athletic training. Prior to going to U-D, Jordan was a graduate assistant at Edinboro State College where she received a Master of Education in Administration degree.

MARY ELLEN WYDAN
Women's Swimming Coach



Head coach Mary Ellen Wydan, now in her third year at Oakland University, has helped the Pioneers continue their success in women's swimming. Wydan guided OU to a 12th-place finish nationally last year after leading a small group of qualifiers to an amazing fourth place in her first season.

Wydan also led Oakland to a pair of winning dual meet seasons. OU won its last six duals in 1983-84, including triumphs over the University of Michigan, Purdue University and Cleveland State University, to reverse itself after losing the first five. Last season, the Pioneers had a 6-3 dual meet mark, and added Michigan State University to its list of victims.

The 24-year-old Wydan, who spent two years as assistant men's and women's swimming coach at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill before arriving at OU, coached a national record holding relay team and OU's first national champion diver, Mary Vincent, during her first year at the helm. Last year, six Pioneer swimmers earned 22 All-America honors, including Nancy Schermer, who as a freshman was the NCAA's 10th best point scorer in Division II.

A native of Lansdale, Pennsylvania, Wydan also worked with swimmers at UNC who produced some outstanding achievements. Polly Winde and Sue Walsh, a triple national champion, both earned spots in the Pan American Games as distance swimmers.

Wydan was a high school standout at North Penn High School, earning Most Valuable Swimmer all four years and prep All-America honors three years. She attended Pennsylvania State University and was a national qualifier on the Nittany Lions' 400 freestyle relay team before transferring to the University of Delaware in 1979.

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1985-86 MEN'S SWIMMING PREVIEW

In 1984-85, Oakland University took its smallest group in years to the NCAA Division II Championships. Subsequently, the Pioneers' sixth-place finish was the worst showing by OU in the nationals since the seventh-place squad of 10 years prior. This year, with five returning swimmers who accounted for 21 All-America awards — plus the team's best recruiting class ever — that should dramatically change.

FREESTYLE: The freestyle squad had no national scorers for the first time in several years in the 100 and 200, but recruiting has greatly aided these events, while the other freestyle units remain strong. The 50 freestyle features returning All-Americans Steve Larson and Mike Koleber, plus NCAA qualifier Steve Ramsey. The addition of freshmen Dan Andrus and Dave Rogowski will make this event even stronger. These two newcomers will also form the backbone of the 100 freestyle, along with Koleber, the lone returnee. In the 200, Koleber and Matt Croghan were national qualifiers, but were shut out of the scoring. Iowa transfer Bruce VerBurg may be the swimmer to make the difference in this event. VerBurg was a Big 10 finalist and Michigan Class A Swimmer of the Year as a prepster. Andrus and fellow freshmen John Monroe and Kirk Raddatz will also swim this event. The 500 will be one of OU's stronger events, led by All-Americans Croghan and Jeff Cooper. Senior Jeff Pryor, plus freshmen Monroe, Raddatz and Mike Nation, will also swim the 500. Croghan was second nationally in the 1,650, and is the nation's leading returnee. Along with Cooper, Raddatz and Monroe, this should also be a strong event.

BUTTERFLY: Recruiting will really make a difference in the butterfly. Four freshmen will compete in the butterfly events, led by Eric Dresbach, fourth in the state and eighth in the junior nationals with a time that would have placed him sixth in the NCAA Division II last year. Mike Nation, who also had a scoring time last year, Dave Rogowski and Mark McDowell, third in Michigan Class B in 1985, make this event a solid one for both the present and future.

BACKSTROKE: One of the nation's best backstrokers, Steve Larson, leads this stroke. Larson qualified first in the 100 and second in the 200, placing second and fifth respectively to earn All-America honors in both. Steve Hussey was a national qualifier in the 100 last year, and he and Larson will be joined in the 100 by Doug Cleland,

a transfer from Tennessee. Larson and Cleland will be joined in the 200 by Bruce VerBurg, who has swam a top-six time in this event.

BREASTSTROKE: Sophomore Mark VanderMey, an All-American in both the 100 and 200 breaststroke as a freshman, returns to lead these events. VanderMey was fourth in the 100 and sixth in the 200 in his first season as a Pioneer. Another sophomore, Jeff Kuhn, qualified for the nationals in both events, and with added improvement could be a scorer in both this year. Rob Carman, a freshman from Troy, will be the third breaststroker and has a lot of potential.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY: Mark VanderMey rules the 200 IM for Oakland as well, placing eighth nationally to earn All-America honors last year. Steve Hussey, a conference finalist in this event, also returns, but the real impact could be made by Doug Cleland and Eric Dresbach, both state finalists in high school. OU is a bit weaker in the 400, where Jeff Cooper was an All-American last year. Cleland and freshman John Monroe will likely join Cooper.

RELAYS: The 400 and 800 freestyle and 400 medley relay squads earned All-America status last year, and many of those swimmers are back. The medley squad was fifth nationally, and returns Steve Larson, Mike Koleber and Mark VanderMey. The 800 freestyle relay also returns three in Larson, VanderMey and Cooper, and will likely be joined by Bruce VerBurg. Those three were also on the 400 free squad, but that unit could sport a new look in newcomers Dan Andrus, Dave Rogowski and VerBurg, among others.

DIVING: For the first time in six years, the Pioneers are optimistic that a diver will score in the nationals. Three freshmen, Matt Ford, Brian Sheehan and Todd McNeal, all state finalists last year in Michigan, comprise the diving unit, which will actually be a Pioneer strength this year.

SUMMARY: "We may send our largest team to the nationals," coach Pete Hovland said. What that depends on is how fast the freshmen develop and how they respond to the pressure of a major national meet. OU has made tremendous improvement in every event thanks to the newcomers and may be able to reach its goal of returning to the top three nationally while winning an unprecedented ninth straight GLIAC title.

1985-86 WOMEN'S SWIMMING PREVIEW

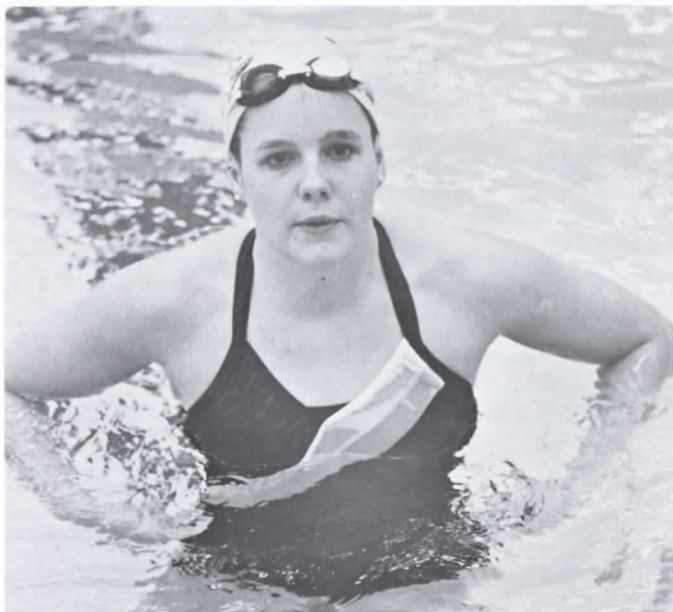

Like the Oakland University men's swimming squad, the Lady Pioneer swimmers sent a small squad to the nationals last year. Also like the men's squad, women's swimming coach Mary Ellen Wydan felt the team's finish (12th place) was a disappointment. In fact, it was OU's lowest finish since it began placing in the NCAA Division II back in 1981-82. This year, four returning All-Americans who earned 18 national honors are back, including the national meet's 10th-best point scorer, Nancy Schermer. With the addition of swimmers who will improve OU's depth in its past weaker events, improvement is certainly predicted for the coming campaign.

FREESTYLE: The freestyle unit is by far OU's top stroke squad. Of the Pioneers' nine individual All-America performances last year, seven were in freestyle events. Both Nancy Schermer and Kim Pogue earned national honors in the 200, 500 and 1,650 freestyle events. While Schermer earned those honors as a freshman, Pogue has been a proven freestyle performer for three seasons, earning 14 All-America titles. Aiding the pair will be returnees Linda Scott and Bonnie Gleffe. Between them Scott and Gleffe earned seven national honors, six in freestyle relays. All four should make the OU freestyle unit strong again. One freshman who could add to the unit's success is Mary Kozinski, who was part of an All-America freestyle squad while at Lansing Eastern High School.

BUTTERFLY: There were no national qualifiers in the butterfly a year ago, but quality veterans and newcomers may change that this year. Linda Scott, an 11-time All-American in her three years at OU, could add a butterfly honor to that list this year. Hard-working junior Becky Peabody has been a consistent dual meet scorer in the butterfly, and with added improvement could threaten national qualifying times. Sophomore Kim Brace swam national qualifying times in high school, but fell short of those marks last year at OU. A return to her prep form would mean great improvement for the butterfly squad.

Freshman Virginia Johnson may provide the biggest help to the unit. The All-Stater at Plymouth Canton High School could qualify in both the 100 and 200 butterfly.

BACKSTROKE: Two newcomers will have a great effect in this event. Freshman Anja Jurges, OU's first foreign-born swimmer, is a potential qualifier in the 200 backstroke. The Swiss-born swimmer will be joined by Western Michigan University transfer Kristi Spicer, a former All-State prep swimmer returning to the pool after a year layoff. Becky Peabody will also swim the backstroke events.

BREASTSTROKE: All-State breaststroker Allison Klump, now an OU sophomore, will carry the banner for the breaststrokers along with freshman Dana Goerke. The hard-working Klump was a top breaststroker while at Saginaw MacArthur High School. Goerke may be the real standout in this stroke. The nationally ranked prep swimmer was second in the state as a junior at Dearborn High School, and has the potential to finish in the top six at nationals.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY: Kim Brace, Virginia Johnson and Becky Peabody will try to give OU quality and depth in the individual medley. Kathy VanValkenburg was the national champion in the IM in 1981, but the Pioneers have struggled in this event since then.

RELAYS: The All-America 800 free relay squad of Gleffe, Pogue, Schermer and Scott returns intact, while the 200 and 400 free relay squads have three members back from last year's All-America contingent. All three should be excellent this year. The 200 and 400 medley relay squads also were national qualifiers, but could finish no higher than 19th. The additions of Dana Goerke at backstroke and Anja Jurges at breaststroke will help these squads, although Goerke will have to make up for the loss of Kathy VanValkenburg.

SUMMARY: "I was disappointed with our showing last year," Wydan said. "Everybody swam well, but we didn't have enough strength, depth and qualifiers. This year we are aiming for a return to the top six."

If the newcomers come through, especially those in strokes other than freestyle, the Pioneers will have a good shot at reaching that goal.
