Transgender Day of Remembrance (TDOR) is an annual observance on November 20 that honors the memory of those whose lives were lost in acts of anti-transgender violence. This is presented in partnership with the Student Program Board, and will be featuring the interactive exhibit "Sharing our Strength" presented by <a href="Iranscend the Binary">Iranscend the Binary</a> to illustrate the resilience of the Trans and Non-Binary community. This event will be open to all staff, students, and faculty there is no registration required.

### World AIDS Day Event | November 30 | 11:30am - 1pm | Gold Room C

This event will be hosting guest speaker Todd Heywood, he has been an active journalist since his first job as an associate editor at age 17 in 1987. His work has uncovered a hate group at Michigan State University, revealed that the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) has been actively tracking and maintaining a database on persons who are tested for HIV, and has been a leading reporter on HIV criminal issues. His work has been cited by the CDC, the Global Commission on HIV and the Law produced by the UN, the U.S. House of Representatives and more. He currently reports for Between The

Lines newspaper, City Pulse, HIV Plus Magazine and TheBody.com. In 2011, he was named one of POZ Magazine's top 100 people and ideas changing the fight against HIV, and also named by TheBody.com as "a person making a difference." In 2014, he was the creator of the successful PrEP4ltNow.com HIV testing and prevention initiative touting the benefits of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) as a prevention option for HIV. He lives in Lansing with his three beloved dogs, Gypsy Rose, Virgil Joshua and Lancelot Gobbo. He has been living with HIV since 2007. Open to all students, staff, and faculty, no registration required.
