ABOUT OAKLAND UNIVERSITY

Oakland University was created in 1957, when the late Alfred and Matilda Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,500–acre estate to Michigan State University to begin a new college in Oakland County.

Named Michigan State University-Oakland, the new campus enrolled its first 570 students in 1959. In 1963, its name changed to Oakland University as the first class graduated with 125 students receiving diplomas. In 1970, the Michigan Legislature recognized the maturity and stature of the university by granting it autonomy and the governor appointed Oakland University's first board of trustees.

From its beginnings, the university has emphasized academic quality, concentrating on providing a dynamic, student-focused learning environment with integration of liberal and professional studies by a faculty of dedicated scholar-teachers. The natural beauty of the campus, much of it still wooded and undeveloped, is enhanced by comprehensive recreational facilities and modern buildings that house the university's many academic and public service programs as well as more than 1,600 residential students.

Dedicated to preparing learners for the new workplace and society, the university is organized into six academic units: the College of Arts and Sciences; and the Schools of Business Administration, Education and Human Services, Engineering and Computer Science, Health Sciences, and Nursing; and The Honors College.

Oakland has 114 bachelors degree programs and more than 80 graduate degree and certificate programs. Doctorates are offered in education; biomedical sciences (with specializations in medical physics, and health and environmental chemistry); reading, systems engineering, physical therapy; and applied mathematical sciences.

The university is continuously adapting to meet the changing needs of students and the marketplace. New programs delivered online and on campus, include master's degree programs in nursing, biology, training and development, software engineering, an Executive MBA program in health care management and innovative Honors College courses. Business and industry partnerships provide unprecedented opportunities for advanced, hands-on learning.

Now, more than 16,900 students attend classes at Oakland University each year and the number of OU alumni has increased to more than 60,000 people.

MISSION

Oakland University has a four-fold mission. It offers instructional programs of high quality that lead to degrees at the baccalaureate, master's and doctoral levels as well as programs in continuing education; it advances knowledge and promotes the arts, through research, scholarship and creative activity; it renders significant public service; and it facilitates student development. In all its activities, the university strives to exemplify educational leadership.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

An edifying note contributed by a certain anonymous doctor of philosophy.

On at least two solemn occasions during the academic calendar–spring and fall commencement—the faculty of the university publicly displays its full academic regalia and participates in the liturgy of processional and recessional, that curious coming and going that symbolizes the ceremony of commencement. The purposes of commencement are well known, but the reasons for the peculiar garb of the celebrants and their odd order of march are often as obscure to the audience as they are, in fact, to the faculty itself. This note may serve to explain academic dress and the professional pecking order it costumes.

Contemporary academics are descendants of clerical schoolmen in the universities of medieval Europe. Like the clergy, members of the bench and bar, and other learned professions, medieval scholars were clothed in heavy robes to stay warm in unheated stone buildings. Like all members of a hierarchical society, the medieval faculties rejoiced in visible insignia of rank. These outward signs of accomplishment and authority were tailored into robes. Although the need for such voluminous garments to keep the scholar from freezing is long past, the use of them as emblems of dignity remains. You will observe that all caps and gowns worn by our faculty are black, with certain disturbing exceptions. Black was the color adopted by mutual agreement among American universities at the end of the 19th century. In Europe, each university has its own distinctive gown, varying in color and cut from all others. A European academic assemblage is a far gaudier occasion than its counterpart in America. Recently, certain universities in this country rashly broke the agreement and authorized robes in their own colors: for example, the crimson of Harvard and green of Dartmouth may be seen in our ranks. This unsuitable spontaneity has been frowned on by sister institutions, yet the mavericks not only persist in their madness, but gain adherents to their ranks with each passing year.

There are three basic academic degrees: the baccalaureate or bachelor's degree, the master's degree, and the doctorate. A special style of robe is prescribed for each. The bachelor's gown is sparsely cut, neat, but a bit skimpy and unadorned, as befits apprentices. The master's gown is still simple, but fuller, sports a sleeve of extraordinary design impossible to describe, and has a hood draped from the shoulders down the back. Once used to keep the frost from the tonsured heads of medieval clerks, the hood is solely a badge of a degree of scholarly

achievement. The master's hood is small and narrow, but displays the colors of the institution that awarded the degree. If you knew the colors of American universities, you could easily identify whence came our masters. The doctoral robe is the most handsome of academic raiment. Generous of cut, of fine aristocratic stuff, it is faced with velvet chevrons on the ample sleeves. You will note that most of the velvet facings and chevrons are black, but that some are of other colors. According to personal taste, the doctor may display the color of his or her doctoral degree on the sleeves and facings: light blue for education, pink for music, apricot for nursing, orange for engineering, and many more. The royal blue of the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) is the most commonly seen in liberal arts institutions such as Oakland. The doctor's hood is the most elegant of all academic appurtenances. Large and graceful, it is lined in satin with the colors of the university that awarded the degree and is bordered with the color of the degree itself. Most academic costumes include the square cap called a mortarboard; the doctor's tassel may be either black or gold tassels of all other degrees are black and stringy.

To instructed eyes, the order of march in the processional and recessional reveals the standing of individuals in the institution's formal hierarchy. In the processional the order of entrance into the hall is, quite fittingly, from most junior to most senior. The baccalaureate candidates enter first, followed successively by the masters and doctoral candidates with the whole separated from the faculty by a decent interval. In the faculty order, the instructors precede the assistant professors that in turn are followed by the associate professors. The august full professors bring up the rear. After a respectful distance come the deans who in turn are separated by a significant space from the awful majesty of the platform party, the vice president, the president, and the members of the board of trustees. All remain standing until the board is seated. After the ceremony, the order of recessional is the reverse of the processional. The greatest dignitaries stream out first, with the artfully organized ranks of priority wallowing in their wake.

It is hoped that these notes may make more intelligible the spectacle you are witnessing today. A discerning intelligence may detect in it many clues to an understanding of the academic profession as it confronts the ambiguities of the future with ancient wisdom and dignified confidence.

THE MACE AND PRESIDENT'S MEDALLION

In medieval times, a Mace was used in warfare. The Mace is one of the oldest traditions in academe dating back to the early 1400's when it transitioned from warfare to ceremonial use. Considered a symbol of the university itself, the scepter Mace is carried by the university marshal during commencement, convocation and other ceremonial events to signify the arrival of the faculty processional. Oakland's Mace, created in 1994, was crafted by jeweler and OU alumnus, Paul Haig and designer Robert Dobbie of P.R. Haig Jewelers in Rochester.

The 30-inch long, approximately 8-pound mace has a white oak handle trimmed with sterling silver ribbon. A black obsidian disk on top is ringed with silver and is inscribed with the university motto. Obsidian is a natural black glass formed by the earth. On each side of the obsidian disk, there is a 14k yellow gold sail. On the base of the handle, a gold oak tree was modeled after a live tree on campus. The clean, straightforward design of the mace reflects the fact that Oakland University is a contemporary institution.

The President's Medallion, also created in 1994 by the same jeweler, is six inches in diameter and reveals the university sail, hangs on a silver chain and is worn by the President at ceremonial events. It is a permanent part of the university's president's academic regalia.

Doris Eaton Travis

Doctor of Humanities

Doris Eaton Travis, who receives her honorary doctorate at Oakland University at the age of 100, has had a long and distinguished career as a dancer, actress, business entrepreneur, rancher, author, and supporter of the performing arts and higher education.

She was born in 1904 and began performing at the age of 5 in local stock companies in Washington, D.C. At the age of fourteen she became the youngest performer in the Ziegfeld Follies, appearing over the years with such legendary stars as Will Rogers, Eddie Cantor, W.C. Fields, and Fannie Brice. With three sisters and two brothers appearing in the Follies in the years between 1918 and 1923, the Eaton's became a well-known performing family during Broadway's golden age.

After several years in the Follies, Doris traveled to Egypt to appear in the silent film "Tell your Children" and later commuted between Hollywood for films and Broadway for stage extravaganzas.

In 1929, Nacio Herb Brown wrote the song "Singin' in the Rain" for her to sing in a special dance number at the Hollywood Music Box Review. Although the song made Gene Kelly famous, it was Doris Eaton who introduced it to the world.

During the Depression, when the curtain fell on the light entertainment industry, Doris made the transition from actress and dancer to dance teacher at the Arthur Murray Studios of Social Dance. She eventually went on to become owner of a chain of eighteen Arthur Murray dance studios in Michigan, which she operated for thirty years.

During the dance studio days, she married her dancing partner Paul Travis. After selling the dance studio business, Doris and Paul moved to Oklahoma and founded a horse ranch that was a center for horse breeding and racing. After Paul's death, she continued to run the ranch, but now it is for boarding rather than breeding. She calls it the Travis Ranch Nursing Home for Horses.

Ms. Travis spent seven years writing her memoir, *The Days We Danced*, which was published by the University of Oklahoma Press in 2003. It provides a panoramic and uniquely personal view of the performing arts in America in the twentieth century. The author is a tireless signer of autographed copies at bookstores across the country.

In 1992, at the age of eighty-eight, Ms. Travis became the oldest graduate of the University of Oklahoma. She is now pursuing a master's degree in liberal studies.

Since the age of ninety-five, Ms. Travis has danced annually on Broadway for various benefits such as the Phyllis Newman Women's Health Initiative and the Broadway Cares Annual Easter Bonnet Competition, which raises money for AIDS-related causes.



Ms. Travis has generously supported higher education through the Doris and Paul Travis Professor Program in the College of Arts and Sciences at Oakland University and through support of endowed chairs of medicine at the University of Oklahoma.

As to her longevity, Ms. Travis points out that she does not take any medication and does not follow a special diet. Her exercise regimen consists of walking around her house.





Summa Cum Laude 3.90 - 4.00 Magna Cum Laude 3.75 - 3.89 Cum Laude 3.60 - 3.74

Students who have earned University Honors wear a gold cord over their academic regalia.

Each student who has a record of superior achievement in a major field of study is awarded departmental honors and is identified by a red cord worn over academic regalia.

Conciliar Honors are awarded by the Faculty Council for General Studies to outstanding graduates of the General Studies program, who are identified by a red cord worn over academic regalia.

NATIONAL HONORS ORGANIZATIONS

An orange cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Beta Alpha Psi, the national scholastic and professional accounting society.

A green cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Beta Gamma Sigma, the honor society for schools of business administration accredited by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business.

A purple cord with white tassels worn over academic regalia indicates membership in the Golden Key International Honour Society.

A madonna red and blue cord with multicolored tassels indicates membership in Phi Alpha Theta, the international honor society in history.

Graduates of the Master of Public Administration Program who earned membership in Pi Alpha Alpha, the national honor society of public affairs and administration, wear a gold medallion attached to a gold and peacock blue ribbon.

A double gold cord with royal blue and gold tassels worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Psi Chi, the National Honor Society in Psychology.

A brown cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Tau Beta Pi, the National Engineering Honor Society.

A royal blue cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Eta Kappa Nu, the National Electrical Engineering Honor Society.

Membership in Sigma Theta Tau, the International Honor Society of Nursing, is indicated by a lavender cord worn over academic regalia.

A cardinal and black cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Sigma Tau Delta, the International English Honor Society.

A kelly green and oriental gold cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in the Human Resource Development Honor Society.

A royal blue and gold cord worn over academic regalia indicates membership in Omicron Delta Epsilon, the Inertnational Honor Society in Economics.

Graduates in the Master of Arts in Counseling program who earned memebership in Chi Sigma Iota, the international honor society for students, professional counselors, and counselor educators, wear the blue and white honor cords over their academic regalia.
