Darlene Schott-Baer embraces the challenge of developing creative programs to attract students to the School of Nursing and prepare them for future careers in nursing. She was one of the first to volunteer to develop and teach two courses for the RN to BSN completion program that is offered completely online. She also provides mentorship to faculty who are new to the development of online courses.

While the nursing profession faces a shortage of qualified faculty to teach nursing students, Schott-Baer spearheaded the creation of an MSN program in nursing education and will teach the first course in the education sequence during fall 2004.

Schott-Baer also developed a competitive RN to MSN program that fosters professional development beyond the BSN degree, favorably positioning the School of Nursing to recruit future students. She received a \$15,000 grant to recruit students and create two courses that fulfill requirements in the RN to BSN, RN to MSN, or MSN program.
