NOTES FROM FACULTY SUB READ LIKE 'EXODUS REVISITED'

The past few months witnessed the largest change of home ownership in the history of the faculty sub. Ronald A. DeVore (mathematics) and family have bought and moved into the Lawrence Sullivan house; Y. C. Wu (mathematics) and family are settling into the Thomas D. Strong house; Thomas W. Casstevens (political science), who is studying at Dartmouth until later this summer, has bought the former home of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Tombouljian; Carol Andreas (sociology and anthropology) and her husband have built a new home on Heidelberg Drive, and have put it on the market for sale; construction has begun for a home on Cambridge Drive for George E. Richards (engineering) and his family; the Robert C. Howes (history), Harvey A. Smith (mathematics), and Alfred Lessing (philosophy/Charter College) homes have been let to persons not connected with the University, and the latter two are for sale, as is the house of George Engeman (modern languages); the University is the temporary owner of the former homes of Richard Robinson, who is now coach and faculty member of Oakland Community College, and Bruce Danner, now on the faculty of Rose Poly at Terre Haute.

'RIGHT NOW' PRAISED

A resolution commending Oakland University students for their effort behind PROJECT RIGHT NOW: BEAUFORT, a drive to help a destitute community in South Carolina, was introduced by Rep. Donald E. Bishop and passed by the House last week. The resolution stated in part: "In a time when campus demonstrations capture most of the college-related headlines and most constructive projects go unnoticed, it is fitting that tribute be paid this humanitarian project, initiated by students who feel compelled to do something immediately about starvation conditions in this Deep South community. . .therefore be it resolved. . .that the highest tribute be paid the initiators and participators of PROJECT RIGHT NOW: BEAUFORT at Oakland University and to University officials who have aided and encouraged this fine project."

DISC JOCKEY RIDES US

A gag phone call from WXYZ disc jockey Dick Purtan was fielded last week by Helen Christ (community relations) and a taped record of their conversation was scheduled to be broadcast at some indefinite time during Purtan's morning show. Purtan pretended to be an irate Louisianan who wanted his money back--plus mileage from New Orleans--after attending the Eddy Arnold concert of the Special Events Series two weeks ago. A replacement performer or group was being sought late last week for the Tuesday, July 15, concert in the Special Events Series in Baldwin Pavilion. The University received a cancellation of booking from the scheduled performers, Jose Feliciano and the New Christie Minstrels. As a reminder, there are two Special Events Series concerts, both being presented under the auspices of the Meadow Brook Summer School of Music. Pianist Vladimir Ashkenazy and violinist Itzhak Perlman, both artists-in-residence this summer, will give a duo recital at 8:30 p.m. Tuesday. And on Wednesday, Jennie Tourel and Jon Vickers will be soloists for a performance of Mahler's "Das Lied von der Erde" by the Meadow Brook Orchestra, James Levine conducting.
