CALENDAR DETAILS

LAST LECTURE SERIES: Dr. Susskind is the first of a group of professors who will pretend they are delivering their last lecture. The series is sponsored by the special events committee of the Student Activities Council.

UNITED NATIONS DAY: Dr. Appleton's address is part of the UN Day Program sponsored by the Rochester Village Council and League of Women Voters. Faculty and staff are invited.

FRENCH VISITOR: Mr. Morot-Sir of the French Cultural Services in New York and Chief Representative of French Universities in the United States will visit the MSUO campus Monday. He will speak briefly on present-day French youth.

MASQUERADE PARTY: The record dance is sponsored by the Student Activities Council. There will be a contest for best costumes. Cider and doughnuts will be served. Admission is 50¢ stag, 75¢ per couple.

PARKING PENALTIES: Mr. Swanson announces that in order to insure the safety of the student body and staff and to avoid unnecessary congestion, it has become necessary to assure that automobiles park only in the designated areas. These areas are ample to accomodate all requirements.

The University does not have funds to employ a traffic patrolman to enforce parking regulations and hopes voluntary cooperation will solve the problem.

To discourage parking in the areas marked no-parking or restricted parking, the University has arranged with the University Cities Service Station at the corner of Walton Boulevard and Pontiac Road to tow away automobiles parked in violation of the signs.

The violator can redeem his auto by paying the towing charge at the service station. Enforcement will become effective Monday.

RADIO BROADCASTS: "Ethic for Broadcasting", a 13-week documentary radio series produced and written by Mrs. Cusack, is now being broadcast each Wednesday, 8 p.m. - 8:30, on station WDET FM, Detroit, (101.9 meg.) as well as by 54 other university and commercial stations. The pilot study for the series was sponsored by an MSUO faculty grant, and the series itself sponsored by a grant from the National Association of Educational Broadcasters. The series includes taped interviews with 43 men who work in broadcasting. Included are David Brinkley, Martin Agronsky, David Susskind, Mike Wallace, John Daly and Edward R. Murrow.
