MATH CONFERENCE: On September 13, Messrs, McKay, Wisner, Hetenyi, and Pope met with a committee from the Pontiac School District to discuss a suggestion for training future secondary school math teachers. The plan would provide for the teaching to high school classes of selected topics by future teachers at various times throughout their four years in college, probably a total of thirty or forty times. Regular teachers would sit in, turning in reports to MSUO with comments and suggestions. The next step is to obtain approval of secondary school principals.

CONTINUING EDUCATION: A grant has been received from the Center for the Study of Liberal Education for Adults to evaluate various methods for involving community leaders and community clubs in liberal arts studies. NOTES FROM ADMINISTRATIVE GROUP MEETING SEPTEMBER 13

MSUO SUBDIVISION: Mr. Varner asked Mr. Swanson to prepare an explanation of the decision to place a \$25,000 limitation on homes built in the MSUO subdivision. Mr. Swanson is also preparing an information brochure on policies and regulations for building in the subdivision.

PURCHASING: Mr. Swanson announced that the purchasing functions for MSUO will be transferred from MSU to his office by January 1. Mr. Swanson will also prepare a leaflet on purchasing procedures to assist those not familiar with these details.

EVENING CREDIT COURSES: Mr. Stoutenburg presented the need for expanding the evening credit offering to meet growing requests of last year's students. It was agreed that an Arts course will be added to the present schedule. Messrs. Stoutenburg and Hoopes were asked to weigh any further additions.

COUNSELING: Mr. Varner again reviewed the Academic Counseling system and explained the urgency for setting up a more effective program, including mid-term reports on students' progress.

TESTING: Mr. Alexander announced that the American College Testing Service has chosen MSUO as one of its test centers for this school year.

CONTINUING EDUCATION: Mr. Eklund announced that spouses of members of the Assembly will be permitted to enroll in the MSUO Continuing Education classes without charge if space is available.
