

Welcome to the 32nd season of the Meadow Brook Music Festival. Oakland University is proud to offer this summer tradition featuring world-class entertainment at our beautiful outdoor amphitheatre.

The Meadow Brook Music Festival is an extension of the university's role to serve the community through diverse educational and cultural programming.

While you enjoy your time on the festival grounds today, may I remind you that just over these rolling hills is an entirely different side of our campus. Oakland University is committed to offering quality education, training and award-winning cultural events for the people of the state of Michigan. We are an innovative university devoted to excellence and positioned to seize unique opportunities for tomorrow and beyond.

Oakland University is growing in a number of ways. Enrollment has hit a record 13,165 and is expected to grow to 15,000 within several years. We are actively lobbying in Lansing for a new classroom building to accommodate enrollment growth. Construction is well underway for our new \$43 million science and engineering complex, scheduled for completion in 1996. Shortly after that, Oakland plans to open a new \$37 million student recreation and athletic center.

We are growing too, in ways that will help Oakland become the model student-centered, technology-enhanced university to better serve our community. Every month more than two million computer users from around the world, including more than half of our students, log-on to Oakland's Oak Archive, one of the busiest host machines on the Internet today. Prospective students can now apply to Oakland on-line and gain screenfuls of other useful information about our academic programs and services, registration and class offerings, and schedule of events. This fall, our first distance learning classrooms will come on-line and Oakland will be able to deliver interactive video instruction to many more remote locations.

On the cultural side, Meadow Brook Theatre will celebrate its 30th anniversary under the artistic leadership of Geoffrey Sherman, the theatre's new artistic director. Please come back to visit us during what we hope will prove to be a memorable 1995-96 season.

Another Oakland tradition, the Concours d'Elegance, will be held on the grounds of Meadow Brook Hall on August 6, featuring some 250 internationally renowned vintage automobiles and 14 car artisans.

Thank you for participating in the life of our university. With your continued involvement and support, Oakland University will be able to continue its devotion to excellence in serving the citizens of our state.


Oakland University represents the educational heart of the state's fastest-growing county. Beginning with its charter class in 1963, Oakland has graduated more than 45,000 well-educated men and women, more than 85 percent of whom continue to live and work in Michigan. Oakland further advances regional development through innovations in research and public service from an outstanding faculty.

## Training and Education

Success in a world of rapidly changing technology requires a work force that keeps pace. Oakland University understands the pressures and demands on business to train and educate employees economically and efficiently while still producing goods and services. Oakland University faculty and staff excel in designing and implementing innovative, convenient training and education programs, both at company locations and on campus.

## Research and Development

Quality research and development strengthens individual enterprises and the collective economy. Oakland's



faculty, while also dedicated to classroom instruction, engage in wide-ranging research collaborations with business,

industry and the community. Cutting-edge expertise, a burning desire to solve life's mysteries and flexibility in approach have produced numerous advancements for community partners, many attracting worldwide attention and emulation.

## Lifelong Education

The School of Nursing offers registered nurses an opportunity to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree on-site at four Michigan hospitals. The degree completion sequence is available for RNs



through collaboration with William Beaumont Hospital, Royal Oak; Henry Ford and St. John Hospitals, Detroit; and Providence Hospital in Southfield.

## Internships and Co-ops

Today's top students need real-world experience to complement classroom instruction. Businesses can use fresh infusions of talent to help them through periods of peak demand. In 1994, area employers benefited from the academic skills, motivation and high level of performance of more than 300 Oakland co-ops and interns, who generated \$1.7 million in earned wages. 
## Culture and Recreation

Oakland University offers a variety of events and programming to the community, from sports and the arts to continuing education opportunities. The Concours



d'Elegance is among the top three classic auto shows in the world and is held annually on the grounds of Meadow Brook Hall. The Department of Music, Theatre and Dance offers a diverse season of student and faculty performances. Children in area schools find fun and enrichment at the

university's Arts-for-Youth Camps and Concerts for Youth, plus specialty sports camps. The campus continues to attract nationally renowned speakers, recently hosting lectures by former hostage negotiator and hostage Terry Waite and fairness and minority rights activist Lani Guinier.

Oakland University's cultural enterprises attract more than 500,000 visitors each year. The award-winning professional Meadow Brook Theatre offers a full season of plays, from classics to world premiere productions. Businesses that have sponsored performances include Ameritech, ITT Automotive, DuPont Automotive Products, Comerica, Inc., Ford Motor Company, Consumers Power and CMI International.

Meadow Brook Hall, the historic 100-room Tudor mansion and former home of Oakland's benefactors, hosts more than 60,000 people each year for business meetings and seminars, including companies such as Volkswagen of America, Electronic Data Systems, Chrysler Corporation, National Bank of Detroit, General Motors Corporation and Crittenton Hospital. Special events include the annual Concours d'Elegance classic auto show and the Christmas Walk, made possible by volunteers and significant corporate support.

Acclaimed as one of the top 10 courses in Michigan, Oakland's 18-hole championship Katke-Cousins Golf

Course hosts the annual Charlie Gehringer Memorial Meadow Brook Golf Classic and numerous corporate outings each year. The course was built on the site of auto baron John Dodge's original 9-hole layout, and now includes several holes that overlook Meadow Brook Hall.

Oakland University hosts major sponsored sporting events, such as the annual Gus Macker 3-on-3 basketball tournament and the Marriott Soccer Classic, in support of an acclaimed intercollegiate sports program. Oakland's scholar-athletes have won more than 250 All-



America awards in both men's and women's sports and numerous NCAA Division II National championships, including an unprecedented five straight women's swimming titles.

## Community Resource

The annual Business Forum draws hundreds of area executives to hear timely presentations on the economy and business trends by such authorities as Robert J. Eaton, chairman and chief executive officer of the Chrysler Corporation. Oakland's Executives-on-campus program brings top management from companies such as Kmart, FANUC Robotics and Data Systems Network to campus to share their "business smarts" with students.

Oakland's Meadow Brook Health Enhancement Institute provides corporate wellness programs and annual physicals for more than 30 companies, including Ameritech Publishing, EDS, Michigan National Bank and Borg Warner. The institute also operates specialty clinics in cardiac rehabilitation, smoking cessation and stress management.

The Public Affairs Research Laboratory at Oakland University provides expertise in policy analysis, survey research and policy impact statements. The lab has worked with Rochester Hills, Michigan, residents to evaluate city services and Oakland Township to analyze community attitudes toward growth and development.
