## 2018 OUWB Publication Report - Final



## Service of the Month: Interlibrary Loan

Can't find that book or journal article you need? Ever found yourself on a publisher website that asked for credit card payment before you could access an article? *Interlibrary loan to the rescue!* 

While the OUWB Medical Library and the OU Kresge Library have extensive collections, providing access to thousands of journals, books, and other media, no library – even at the largest research university – can possibly own every resource that their users might need and must rely on interlibrary loan networks for items not immediately at hand. The Interlibrary Loan Department at Kresge Library provides a wonderful service, filling the majority of article requests electronically via email within 24 hours. Requests for books take longer since they require more physical processing and transportation. Interlibrary loan is a **free** service for current students, faculty, and staff.


#### **ILLiad & MeLCat**

<u>ILLiad</u> is the online ordering system used for placing requests. First time users will need to register for an account; once that is done, simply log in with your usual OU NetID and password to place orders, retrieve scanned articles, and check on the status of your requests. ILLiad is also incorporated into the **Get It at OU Libraries** buttons you see in the major databases like PubMed, Scopus, and PsycInfo.

 NOTE: Remember to start your PubMed searches from the <u>link</u> or search box on the OUWB Medical Library website in order to see the "Get it" button and access the ILLiad service, especially when you are off-campus.



MelCat – the Michigan eLibrary Catalog – is a way to request books from other participating Michigan libraries. Requested books are then delivered to the OU Kresge Library for you to pick up.
