ABOUT OAKLAND UNIVERSITY

In 1957, the late Alfred G. and Matilda R. Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,500-acre Meadow Brook estate to Michigan State University to establish a college in Oakland County.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 as a branch campus of MSU, with 570 first-year students. By the mid-1960s, it had evolved into a medium-sized university and in 1970 became an independent, state-assisted university. It now offers more than 70 undergraduate programs and more than 30 graduate programs, and enrolls about 12,000 students.

OU's distinct instructional programs — the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Economics and Management, School of Engineering and Computer Science, School of Health Sciences, School of Human and Education Services and School of Nursing — offer a diverse curricula of general education and career preparation courses. Virtually all of these courses are taught by faculty members, not teaching assistants.

The Honors College, a division of the College of Arts and Sciences, meets the educational needs of highly motivated students. The Division of Continuing Education meets the needs of nontraditional adult learners through evening and extension programs.

Academic support facilities include such notable entities as the Eye Research Institute, the only major eye research center in the United States not affiliated with a medical school; the Meadow Brook Health Enhancement Center, which provides health maintenance/health improvement and cardiac rehabilitation community outreach programs; and the Center for Robotics and Advanced Automation, a unit of the school of Engineering and Computer Science that utilizes high technology manufacturing methods.

And OU's professional arts programs annually attract thousands to the campus. OU has received national recognition and local kudos for its Meadow Brook Theatre, Meadow Brook Art Gallery, Meadow Brook Hall and Meadow Brook Music Festival, the summer home of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

OU is located 25 miles north of Detroit, in the small town of Rochester. OU's modern campus, which houses the university's many academic and public service programs, is located on a beautifully wooded site — much of it still undeveloped.



OU ATHLETIC STAFF

Dr. PAUL HARTMAN, *Athletic Director*



In his career as an athletic director, one which has spanned three decades and covered four different institutions, Dr. Paul Hartman has been one to make visible changes wherever he has been.

The programs Hartman has instituted at Oakland University have been plentiful. The department began a Varsity "O" Club for former athletes, brought back baseball as a varsity sport, and made several changes in the Lepley Sports Center — ranging

from a refurbishing of the locker rooms and equipment area to renovation of the offices and the addition of the Pioneer Lounge, which is used for conferences and athletic receptions.

Previously Hartman had developed additional summer camp programs, created a new season ticket plan and instituted a Hall of Honor for exceptional Pioneer athletes, as well as introduced the first athletic team banquet. Additionally since Hartman's arrival, there has been a large changeover in the coaching staff, as well as in the department's support staff.

Now in his seventh year at Oakland, the veteran athletic administrator still sees more changes for OU on the horizon.

Hartman, Oakland's third director of athletics, succeeded Corey Van Fleet in June of 1983. The only other AD was OU's founding father of Athletics, Hollie Lepley.

A graduate of Ohio State University and a native of Columbus, Ohio, Hartman lives in Rochester with his wife, Jane.

TOM FORD, *Head Athletic Trainer*

Tom Ford begins his first full year as Oakland University's head athletic trainer. Ford joined the OU staff in January. Ford came to Oakland from Cypress Creek High School in Houston, where he was the school's head trainer for five-and-a-half years. Ford went to Cypress Creek after earning a Master of Science degree in Physical Education with a specialization in athletic training from the University of Arizona. He earned a bachelor of science degree from Ball State University. Ford, who has served as a trainer at sports festivals and Olympic Training Centers, will travel to Bulgaria in February as a part of the US contingent to the Winter World University Games. Tom and his wife, Kathleen, live in Rochester with their sons Tom, Jr. and Travis.

RON FORBES, *Business Manager*

Entering his 19th year at Oakland, Ron Forbes, serves as business manager for the athletic department. A graduate of Western Michigan University and a native of Royal Oak, he also handles ticket distribution and receipts for the Pioneers.

ANDY GLANTZMAN, *Sports Information Director*

In his fourth year as Sports Information Director is Andy Glantzman. Andy joined the Pioneer staff in August, 1985 after six years in the University of Detroit's Sports Information Office. This Brooklyn, New York native has won six publications awards from CoSIDA, including three last year. Glantzman earned a bachelor of science degree in athletic administration from St. John's University (NY) and an Master of Business Administration from U of D. He and his wife, Kim, live in Redford.

TRACY HUTH, Women's Swimming Coach



Tracy Huth was, and still is, a large part of the tremendous men's swimming tradition that exists at Oakland University. Huth has now begun the task of installing that tradition in the women's program as its head coach.

Huth went a long way towards that goal in just his first year as the OU women's coach. The Pioneers took nine swimmers to the national championships, five more than the previous year, and captured a sixth place ending.

"One of the big things I knew this program needed when I took over was numbers, both on the squad and qualifying for nationals," Huth said. "We've taken a big step in that direction, but we still have a way to go."

Building up numbers is one thing Huth has experience in. As coach of the Oakland Live Y'ers youth swimming team for the two years prior to taking over the OU women, Huth took a struggling program to a point where it had to close enrollment.

This year Huth will have to use numbers to replace 24-time All-American Nancy Schermer. The Olympic Trials qualifier ended her fabulous OU career last year with seven All-America honors, and left Oakland with her name on eight school records.

"I'm really glad Nancy ended her career so well," Huth said. "She is a big meet swimmer, always mentally prepared. What she has accomplished is above and beyond what any of us could have hoped for."

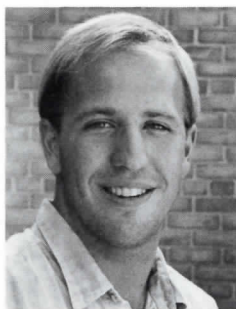
Huth was three times NCAA Division II Swimmer of the Year, earning the award as a sophomore, junior, and senior. He was a rare 24-time All-American while at OU, and also claimed 12 national championships. Huth dominated the individual medley events from 1981-1984, winning national titles all four years in both the 200 and 400 IM. His other four championships came as part of relay units. In his four years, Huth was instrumental in four top three finishes, including three second place endings.

JEFF COOPER, Assistant Coach



Jeff Cooper joins Tracy Huth's OU women's swimming staff as an assistant coach after four successful years on the OU men's swimming team.

Cooper was a 10-time All-American in his four years at Oakland. Included in his national honors were top 12 finishes in his specialty, the 400 yard individual medley, all four years as a Pioneer swimmer. Cooper also earned All-America honors in the 500 and 1,650 freestyle and with the 400 and 800 free relay units.

Cooper was also a dominant swimmer in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championship meet, winning 11 GLIAC championships. He won four titles apiece as a freshman and junior, and was selected as GLIAC Swimmer of the Year in his freshman year.

An OU team co-captain, Cooper helped lead the Pioneers to four straight GLIAC crowns and four top six national team finishes, including back-to-back second place endings in his junior and senior years.

Cooper was an outstanding high school swimmer at Swartz Creek High School. The 200 and 500 freestyle state finalist was Swartz Creek's Swimmer of the Year as a senior in 1984, and was an All-League performer and state qualifier in golf as well.

DON MASON, Diving Coach



Starting his fifth season as OU diving coach is Don Mason, who had three divers earn All-America honors a year ago. Included in that trio is Nikki Kelsey, a junior who placed fourth on the three-meter board a year ago.

Mason was the national three-meter diving champion in Division II while at Wayne State University in 1981. The four-year letterwinner at Wayne still holds the GLIAC and OU pool records for 11 dives in both the one- and three-meter events. The seven-time All-

American won both events in the league that year.

Prior to coming to Oakland, Mason served in the same capacity at his alma mater. At Wayne he produced four diving All-Americans, including Susan and Lisa Giershick. Mason has exceeded that total at Oakland with last year's trio of Kelsey, Mark Duff, and Jill Thompson.

Mason, who also coached at Birmingham Marian High School, currently coaches the Precision Diving Association. The native of Bloomfield Hills is a graduate of Andover High School.

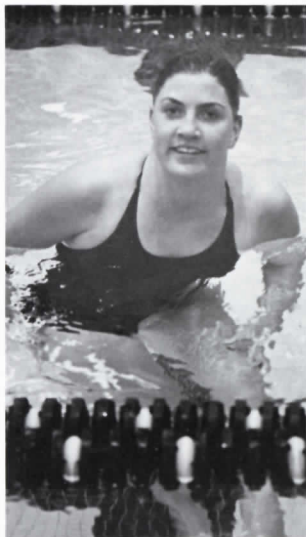

WOMEN'S SWIMMERS SET SIGHTS ON GLIAC, NATIONAL TOP FIVE

Oakland University women's swimming coach Tracy Huth had a goal in mind when he took over the program last year. He wanted to return OU to the status it enjoyed previously — that of top national finishes and numerous All-Americans. It took him just one year to increase the squad numbers, and with that improve the team nationally. OU placed sixth in the nation a year ago, and had 10 swimmers win 30 All-America honors.

This year he is looking for that improvement to continue. And there's another goal for OU to shoot for. The Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference will offer a women's swimming championship for the first time this year. OU and Northern Michigan will likely battle it out for the crown. Hillsdale, Ferris State, and Grand Valley State will also compete.



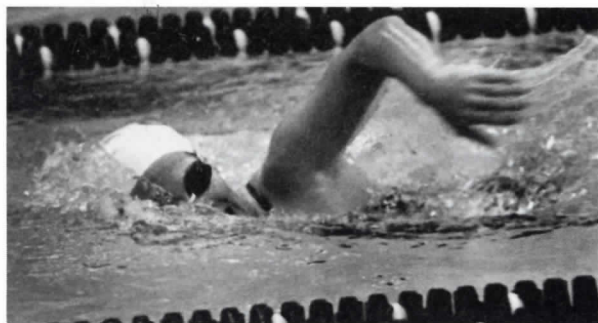

Schermer is gone and another comes to Oakland in Nancy's sister, Lyn. Lyn was the Swimmer of the Year in Michigan as a junior, and a member of the Class B state champs as a senior. Another freshman, Karen Haller, will also see action in the middle-distance and distance freestyle events.

BUTTERFLY: Senior Ginnie Johnson and junior Shelley Steyaert bring lots of experience to the flyers. Johnson was an All-American in the 100 fly, while Steyaert earned national honors in the 200. Soph Deanna Fridley showed great improvement as her frosh year progressed and could be ready to reach her qualifying times this year. Freshman Diedra Schepler, an All-Stater in the 100 fly, and Katie Ill will add to Oakland's butterfly depth.

BACKSTROKE: With the graduation of Kristi Spicer, backstroke is a big question mark for OU. Junior Debbie Cheney returns, and three freshmen are also slated to swim this stroke. Kerry Leavoy, fourth in the state in the 100 back, and Karen Smith, another state qualifier, will be joined by Katie Ill as Huth looks for someone to emerge in the backstroke.

BREASTSTROKE: Lisa Guilfoyle emerged as a solid breast-

stroker in her freshman year, earning national honors in the 100. Ginnie Johnson should also see some action in the breaststroke events. Kathy Van Houten, a four-time All-Stater in the 100 as a prepster, and Cindi Parker, are OU's freshmen most likely to achieve in the breaststroke. Wendy Hartwig will also see action in the breaststroke.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY: Ginnie Johnson earned OU's only national honors in the IM, that coming in the 400. Debbie Cheney and Deanna Fridley will join Johnson as OU's main IM'ers among the returnees. Freshmen Jennie Cameron and Lyn Schermer could go a long way towards improving OU's IM performances. Fellow frosh Cindi Parker and Diedra Schepler will also add to OU's depth in these events.

RELAYS: Huth's two main problems in the relays will be finding a backstroker for the medley relays and replacing Nancy Schermer. Otherwise there is an excellent returning nucleus, led by sprinters Pilarski, Guilfoyle and Kennedy, plus Novitski and Johnson. A combination of swimmers will try to replace Schermer, including sister Lyn. Other newcomers who could impact the relays are Jennie Cameron and Kerry Leavoy.

DIVING: OU may have its deepest diving unit ever, with six on the women's unit. Junior Nikki Kelsey is a legitimate championship contender on the three-meter board, and could crack the top six on the one-meter. Susan Brenner is back for her sophomore year, and Shelley Wilson, also a soph, returns after a year lay-off. Among the newcomers, Ann Jacobson and Marie Olsen had solid high school careers and could challenge a national qualifying score. A third freshman, Dawn Berger, rounds out the squad.

If a combination of freshmen can make up for the loss of Nancy Schermer and Kristi Spicer, the top five nationally is not a long shot. Huth is building a young, powerful unit that has only one senior. The present looks bright for OU, and the future looks even better.

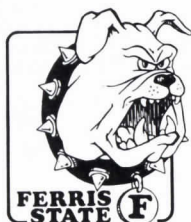

The first championship meet will be held in conjunction with the men's meet at Grand Valley State on February 23-25.

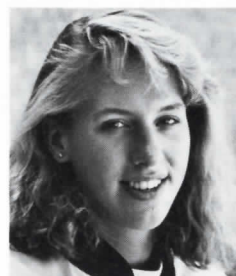

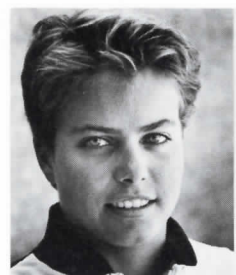
