## 2004 WOCOU a roaring success

The cold, rain and wind forced the "Rock the Roof" party indoors, but it didn't squelch the enthusiasm of the students.

There also was a tremendous response to the art exhibit.

"Students brought their own artwork, and we had a great variety of very professional looking artwork," Miller said.

This year, OU students, faculty and staff raised \$700 to send to the hurricane victims of Florida, the Bahamas and Haiti.

To celebrate the 10th anniversary, a class ring, featuring a diamond, was raffled. The lucky winner was senior William Mullas.

The week ended with Midnight Madnezz on Oct. 15.

"It was packed," Miller said. "Both of the basketball coaches came out on motorcycles in the O'Rena with leather jackets on. When they came out to introduced the teams, they were all in glow sticks and glow balls."
