HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO GATHER FOR CONFERENCE

Oakland University will host student council representatives from high schools throughout the state Saturday, Oct. 6, in a high school leadership conference.

The program is sponsored by the student governments of four universities. They are OU, Michigan State University, University of Michigan, and Wayne State University. Topics will include student apathy and community involvement, student input into new programming, and student rights and responsibilities. Following the day-long program in the Oakland Center, all participants will attend a reception in Meadow Brook Hall.

SCHOLARSHIP ESTABLISHED FOR RECENT OU GRADUATE

The Emily Moses Memorial Scholarship has been established at OU in memory of the recent graduate who was killed Sunday, Sept. 16, in a car accident. Miss Moses studied in New Charter College and she completed her studies this summer.

ALLPORT COLLEGE FACULTY GIVE LECTURES

Carl Vann and Phillip Singer, Allport College, were participants in a Community Mental Health Seminar held recently under sponsorship of the Detroit Psychiatric Institute.

Singer's activities include participation during the past summer in the Siena Heights College Interdisciplinary Institute. He lectured on the topics, "To What Extent Does Man Participate in the Making of His Own Future", "Religion and Creative Confrontation with Technology," and "The Place for Political Action in Religion."

FEEMAN GETS MATH POSITION; THREE FACULTY GIVE PAPERS

George Feeman has been elected chairman of the Michigan Section of the Mathematical Association of America for 1973-74 and three other Department of Mathematics faculty have attended major conferences.

Feeman will represent the Mathematical Association on the Executive Council of the Michigan Academy of Science, Arts and Letters.

William C. Hoffman chaired a session on "Neural Models" at the recent Sixth Annual Mathematical Psychology Meeting at the University of Montreal, where he also presented a paper on "The Frontal Intrinsic System of the Brain as a Functor on the Category of Fibre Bundles". Prior to the Montreal meeting he participated in the 14th Biennial Seminar of the Canadian Mathematical Congress at the University of Western Ontario.

Donald Malm and Irwin Schochetman attended a summer meeting of American Math Society at the University of Montana in Missoula. He gave a talk entitled "Hilbert Schmidt Induced Representation" and chaired a session for papers on functional analysis.

Harvey Smith attended a Sept. 1-23 conference on "Algebra in Analysis" in Birmingham, England.

APPLICATIONS OPEN FOR FULBRIGHT-HAYS AWARDS

Applications will be accepted until Thursday, November 1, for junior lectureships in American studies in Belgium, France, Italy and Spain for the academic year 1974-75. The lectureships are offered under the Fulbright-Hays Program.

Applicants should be advanced graduate students or scholars who have recently completed the Ph.D., preferably in American literature, American history or government, but also in economics, geography, psychology, or sociology. Good knowledge of French or Spanish is required for appointments in France or Spain.

One award is also to be offered to a junior scholar for research in Belgium in some aspect of Atlantic studies.
