







Student InfoBite Series



Service of the Month: Personal Librarian Program

By now all M1, M2, and M3 students should have received their first emails of the semester from their "personal librarians."

The Medical Library established the Personal Librarian program back in 2017 with the Class of 2021. The program pairs each M1 medical student with a library faculty member – their "personal librarian" – who will remain their primary library contact throughout their medical school career. Goals of the program include fostering a strong student/library faculty member connection, supporting student research and self-directed learning, promoting library resources and services, and, ultimately, contributing to student success.



Librarians will reach out to "their" students periodically with information about services and resources. They are also available for research consultations and assistance with Capstone projects and other assignments. If you'd like to schedule an appointment for a research consultation, you can contact your personal librarian directly (<u>Staff Directory</u>) or schedule an appointment using our <u>Library</u> <u>Consultation Calendar</u>.
