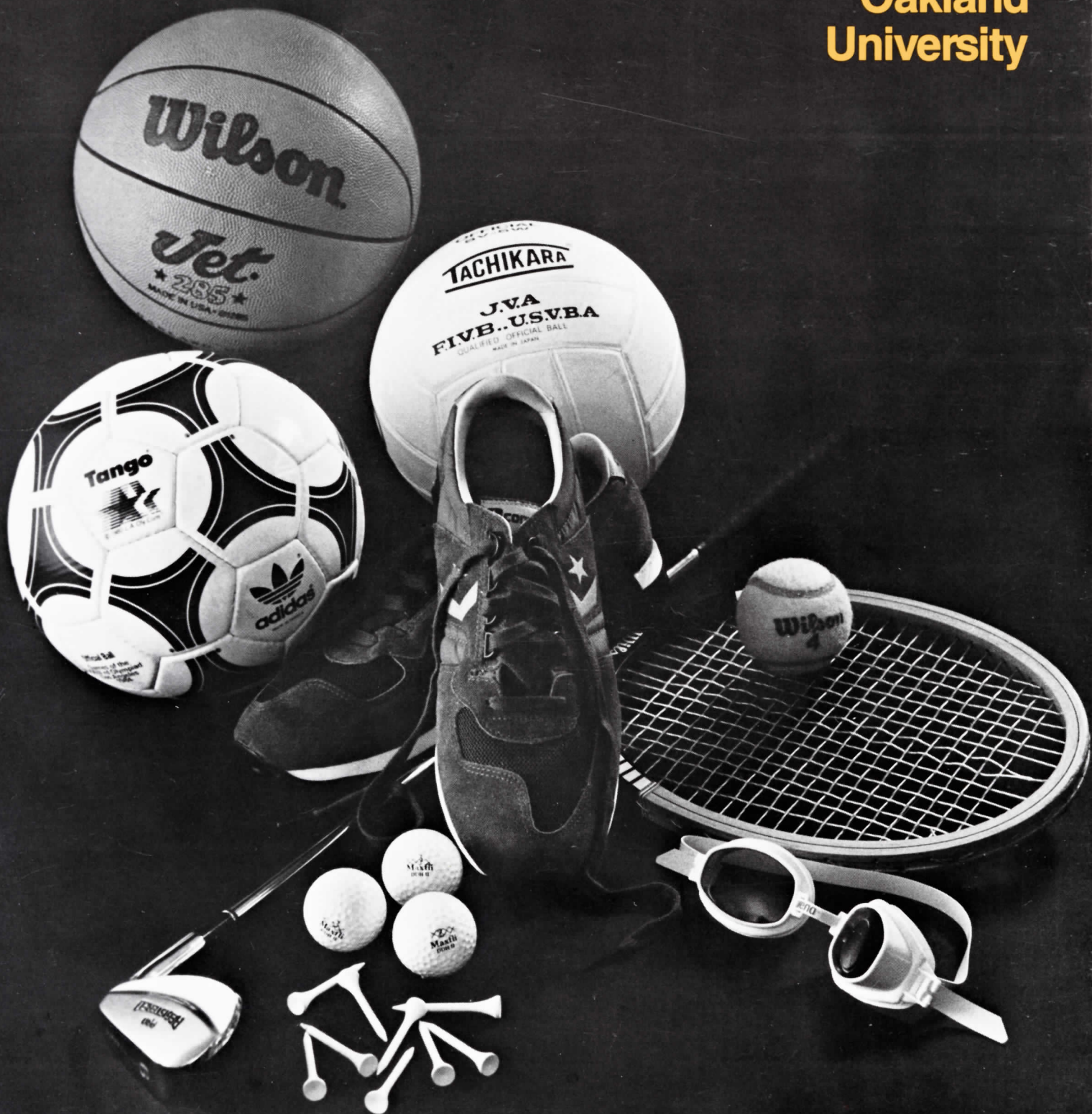
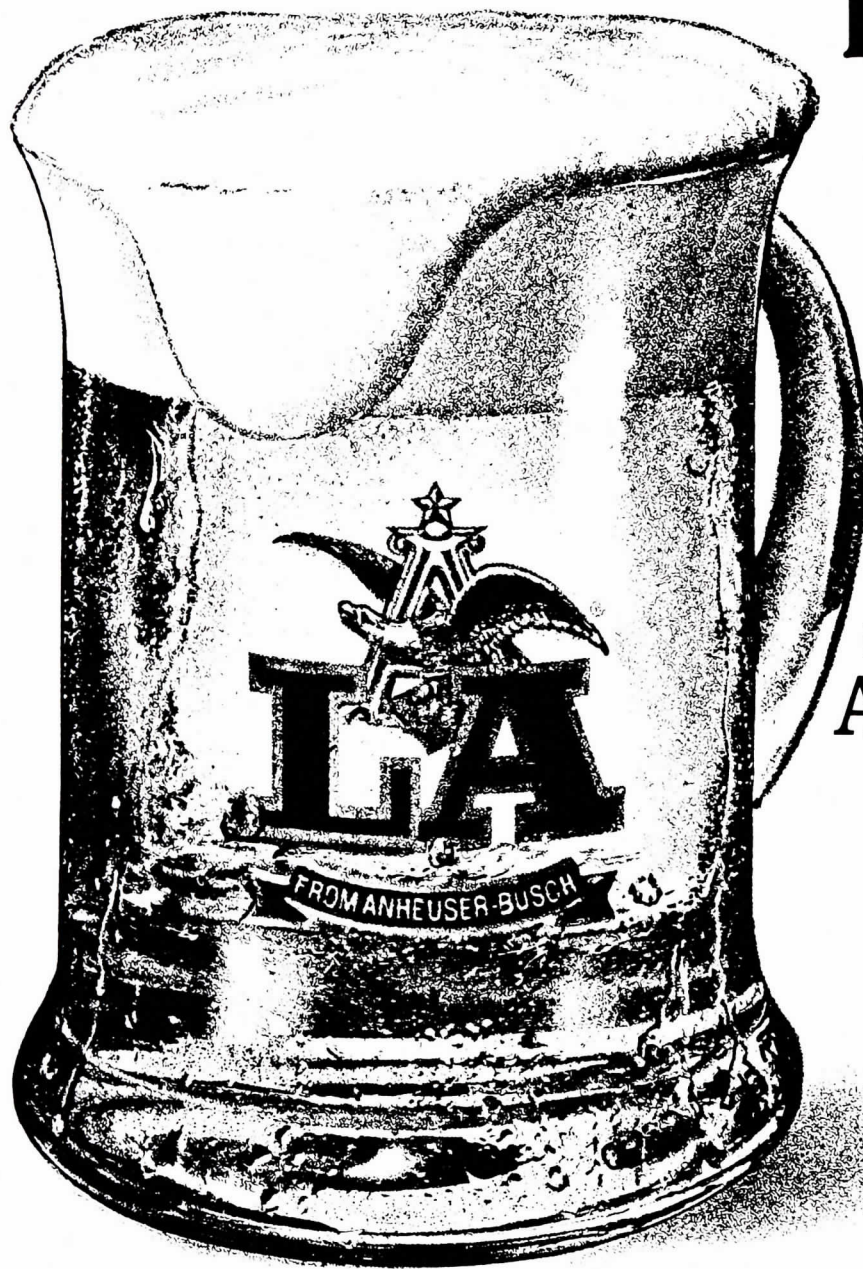


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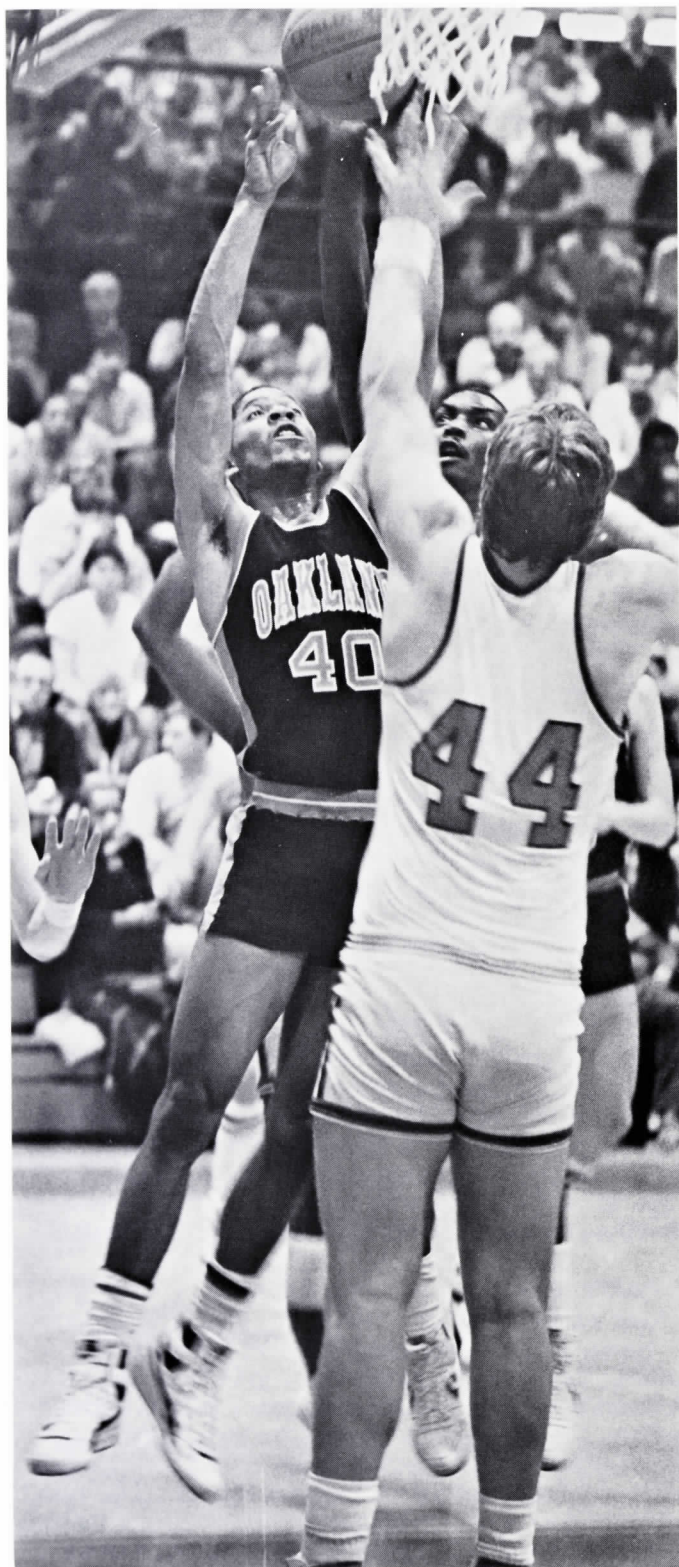

ABOUT OU

In 1957, the late Alfred G. and Matilda R. Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,500-acre Meadow Brook estate to Michigan State University to establish a college in Oakland County.

Oakland University was founded in 1957 as a branch campus of MSU, with 570 first-year students. By the mid-1960s, it had evolved into a medium-sized university and in 1970 became an independent, state-assisted university. It now offers more than 70 undergraduate programs and more than 30 graduate programs, and enrolls about 12,000 students.

OU's distinct instructional programs — the College of Arts and Sciences, School of Economics and Management, School of Engineering and Computer Science, School of Health Sciences, School of Human and Educational Services and School of Nursing — offer a diverse curricula of general education and career preparation courses. Virtually all of these courses are taught by faculty members, not teaching assistants.

The Honors College, a division of the College of Arts and Sciences, meets the educational needs of highly motivated students; the Division of Continuing Education meets the needs of nontraditional adult learners through evening and extension programs.

Academic support facilities include such notable entities as the Eye Research Institute, the only major eye research center in the United States not affiliated with a medical school; the Meadow Brook Health Enhancement Center, which provides health maintenance/health improvement and cardiac rehabilitation community outreach programs; and the Center for Robotics and Advanced Automation, a unit of the School of Engineering and Computer Science that utilizes high technology manufacturing methods.

And, OU's professional arts programs annually attract thousands to the campus. OU has received national recognition and local kudos for its Meadow Brook Theatre, Meadow Brook Art Gallery, Meadow Brook Hall and Meadow Brook Music Festival, the summer home of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

OU is located 25 miles north of Detroit, in the small town of Rochester. OU's modern campus, which houses the university's many academic and public service programs, is located on a beautifully wooded site, much of it still undeveloped.

OU ATHLETIC STAFF

Dr. PAUL HARTMAN

Athletic Director



Dr. Paul Hartman is in his third year as director of athletics at Oakland University. Hartman, only the third director in OU's athletic history, has instituted some innovative changes since arriving in Rochester.

Hartman added personnel, developed additional summer youth camps and offered a new season ticket plan in his first year. He also instituted a Hall of Honor for exceptional Pioneer athletes and

introduced the first athletic team banquet.

A veteran administrator in college athletics at several levels, Hartman served at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point for seven years prior to coming to OU. He also served in similar positions at Florida International University and Plymouth State College in New Hampshire.

Hartman succeeded Cory Van Fleet in June, 1983. The only other department director was the founding father of OU's athletic program, Holly Lepley.

RON FORBES

Business Manager

Entering his 16th year at OU is Ron Forbes, who serves as business manager for the athletic department. A graduate of Western Michigan University and a native of Royal Oak, Forbes also handles ticket distribution and receipts for the Pioneers.

ANDY GLANTZMAN

Sports Information Director

New to the Pioneer athletic department is Andy Glantzman, who replaced Stan Blackford as sports information director in August. Glantzman came to OU from the University of Detroit, where he worked in sports information for six years, three as assistant SID. The Brooklyn, New York, native earned a Bachelor of Science degree from St. John's University and a Master in Business Administration at U-D.

TOM VanVOORHIS

Marketing and Promotions

Tom VanVoorhis handles marketing and promotions for the athletic department. Among VanVoorhis' duties are selling advertising for Pioneer publications, arranging special game and sports camps promotions and scheduling speaking engagements for the coaching staff. The retired General Motors public relations and marketing employee is a graduate of the University of Michigan.

SANDY JORDAN

Head Athletic Trainer

Sandy Jordan is beginning her third year as head athletic trainer at OU. Jordan came to OU from the University of Detroit, where she spent a year as assistant trainer. The native of Rochester, New York, spent four years as a student assistant at Lock Haven State College while earning a Bachelor of Science degree in health and physical education with a specialization in athletic training. Prior to going to U-D, Jordan was a graduate assistant at Edinboro State College where she received a Master of Education in Administration degree.

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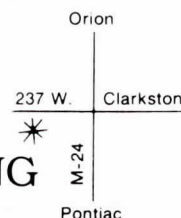
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OU COACHING STAFF

DONNA DICKINSON

Head Women's Tennis Coach

In her fourth year as head coach of women's tennis, Donna Dickinson has been affiliated with the sport for the last 13 years, including 10 as program, activities and tournament director at the Claremont Tennis Club in Claremont, California, before moving to the Michigan area.

Now an employee of the Rochester Hills Racquet Club, Dickinson is an exceptional organizer, having directed Upland High School in California to the boys' soccer state championship game. She is determined to find the same kind of success for the Pioneer women's tennis program.

PETE HOVLAND

Head Men's Swimming Coach

Pete Hovland has continued OU's outstanding tradition in men's swimming. His recruiting and coaching skills have guided OU to two second-place finishes, one third and one sixth in the NCAA Division II Championships in his four years as head coach. One of the finest programs in the country, the Pioneers have finished in the top 10 nationally for the past 11 years.

Selected as Division II Coach of the Year in 1983, the Chico State grad was an assistant under head coach Ernie Maglischo when the Pioneers won the 1980 National Championship. A 23-time All-America swimmer and the 1977 Far Western Conference Swimmer of the Year, Hovland has coached the Pioneers to four straight GLIAC championships.

BOB HURDLE

Head Women's Volleyball Coach

If the Lady Pioneer volleyball squad continues to show the kind of improvement this year that it has in the last three under coach Bob Hurdle, OU will have a championship-caliber team in 1985. In Hurdle's second year, the team set a new school mark with 22 wins, then improved that standard to 32 wins last season.

An excellent recruiter and evaluator of talent, Hurdle does a good job at getting the most out of his players. Before beginning his stint at OU, Hurdle spent six years establishing Andover High School's volleyball program as one of the best in the state by running up a 96-36 record, earning two Southeastern Michigan Association titles and one Greater Oakland Athletic League crown.

GREG KAMPE

Head Men's Basketball Coach

The job of rebuilding the OU men's basketball program is in the hands of one of the Midwest's top young coaches. Greg Kampe spent six years with the outstanding University of Toledo program and coach Bob Nichols as an assistant coach before taking over at OU last year. Kampe earned the reputation as an outstanding recruiter while at UT, acquiring the players that helped propel the Rockets to two National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division I national tournament berths and one in the National Invitational Tournament.

Kampe, who has almost everyone back from his initial

13-15 squad, was an outstanding athlete in his own right. The graduate of Bowling Green State University was the first player in Mid-American Conference history to be named first team All-Academic in both basketball and football.

SUE KRUSZEWSKI

Head Women's Basketball Coach

Success has been the word most often associated with OU women's basketball coach Sue Kruszewski. The OU mentor has not had a losing season in her eight as a college head coach, and her 149-74 record ranks in the top 10 among active Division II coaches.

Before coming to OU, Kruszewski began the women's program at her alma mater, the University of Detroit, and turned it into a national power. She then moved on to the University of Washington, where she built up the Husky program. Kruszewski first made her mark in the Michigan prep ranks, winning state titles at Dominican High School in 1973 and 1974 and accumulating an overall record of 306-63. An outstanding recruiter, Kruszewski has put together classes at OU that should have the Lady Pioneers at the top of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference for a number of seasons.

MIKE OZGA

Head Wrestling Coach

Mike Ozga returns for his second season as head coach after leading the Pioneers to their best season nationally in 1984-85. OU finished 19th in the nation, the first time it's cracked the top 20, and had two All-Americans in sophomores Dave Witgen and Jerry Umin.

A prep Class A finalist, Ozga suffered a career-ending knee injury in his first season at Eastern Michigan University. He earned an associate degree from Macomb Community College in 1979 and was assistant wrestling coach at Marquette High School before coming to OU.

GARY PARSONS

Head Soccer and Tennis Coach

Gary Parsons has done an outstanding job of building one of the nation's best soccer programs in just four seasons. Parsons' squads have been to the NCAA tournament the last three years, twice advancing to the final four. His four-year mark is 62-14-6.

The Mideast Regional Coach of the Year in 1982 and 1983, Parsons has instilled a winning tradition at OU, one he brings with him from his past coaching experiences. As an assistant coach at Eastern Illinois University and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Parsons was a perfect four-for-four in NCAA tournament appearances, making it seven of eight overall. In his eight seasons as a coach, no team of his has won less than ten games in a season.

JOHN STEVENSON

Head Cross Country Coach

John Stevenson begins his second tour of duty as Pioneer cross country coach. Stevenson ran the Pioneer harriers in 1983 after serving as an assistant to Dewayne Jones. Stevenson replaces Terry Dibble this time around.

The director of the exercise science program at OU, Stevenson brings a great deal of racing experience and technical knowledge to the post. His racing experience includes the Boston and Detroit Free Press marathons, while his technical experience comes in the form of research projects in the running aspects of biomechanics.

GEORGE WIBBY
Head Golf Coach

George Wibby is beginning his sixth year as the head golf coach at OU. The hard-working Wibby, an excellent teacher of golf fundamentals, is shooting to put the Pioneers among the contenders at the Division II level.

A graduate of Wayne State University, Wibby served as local director of the American Red Cross for many years and still works with the organization as a volunteer during his spare time.

MARY ELLEN WYDAN
Head Women's Swimming Coach

In just two seasons at the helm, Mary Ellen Wydan has continued to keep OU's women's swimming team among the best in the nation. Wydan has led the Lady Pioneers to a fourth-place and 12th-place finish nationally in her two years at OU.

Wydan also improved OU's dual meet mark to 6-3 with victories over Division I schools Cleveland State University, the University of Michigan and Purdue University for the second straight year, plus a win over Michigan State University by just one point. Her combination of youth and experience should make her and OU successful for years to come.

DR. FRED STRANSKY
Director, Health Enhancement Programs

The rapid development of the OU cardiac rehabilitation program has been significant under Dr. Fred Stransky. Well-respected in medical and athletic circles, Stransky has developed his program from ground level to one of the finest in the Midwest.

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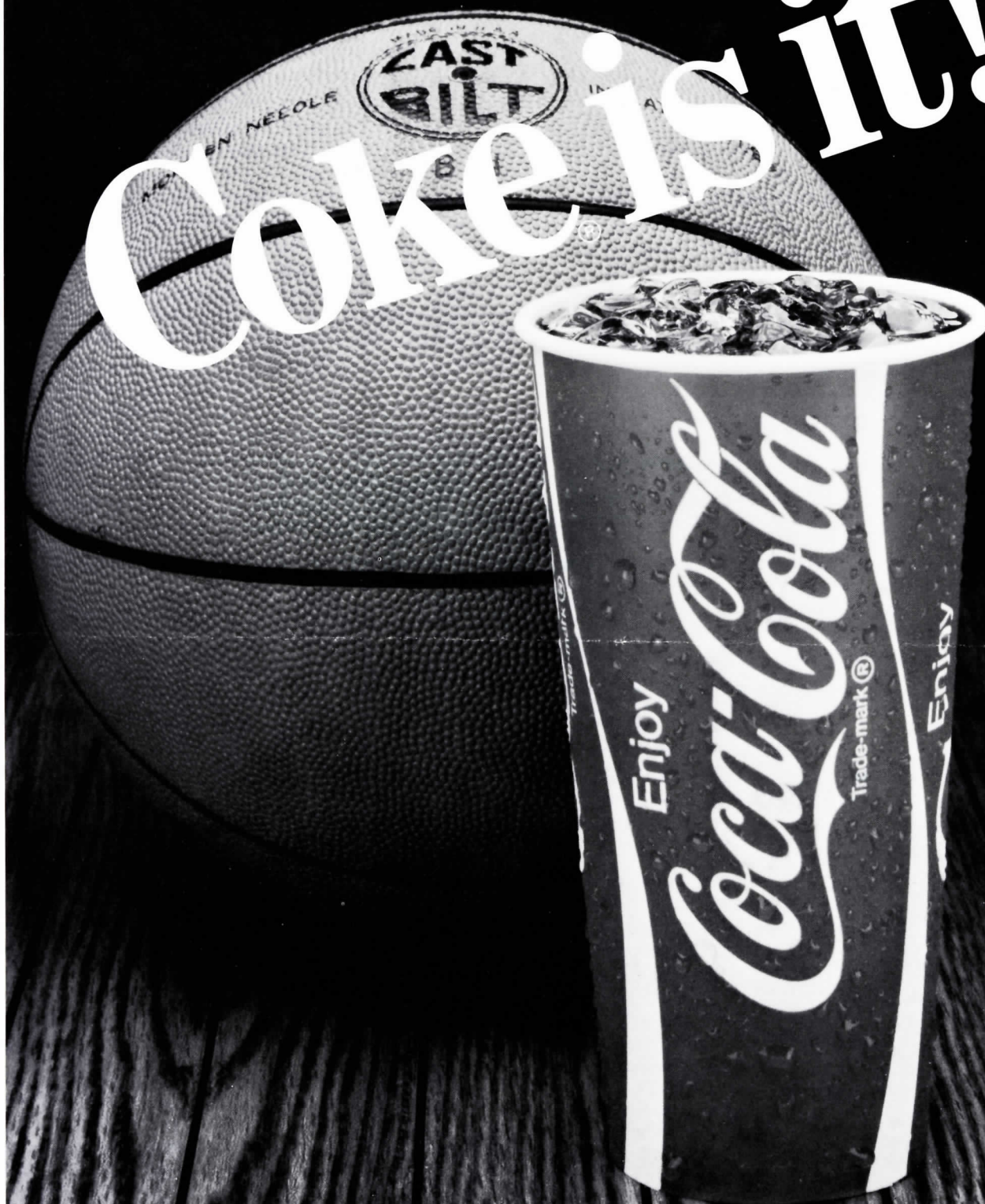

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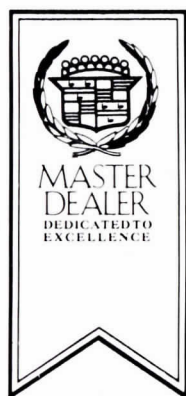
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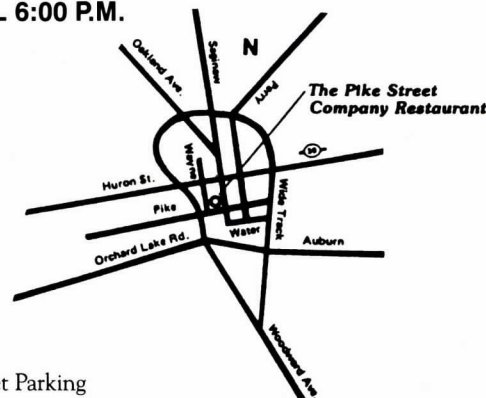
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1984-85 IN REVIEW

The 1984-85 OU athletic campaign saw four squads continue as national contenders in the NCAA Division II. The men's swimming squad finished in the top 10 nationally for the 11th straight season, placing sixth, while their distaff counterparts were 12th in the nation. The wrestling squad cracked the top 20 for the first time ever, placing 19th in the country, while soccer was again among the elite earning a bid to the NCAA tournament.

Individually, 15 athletes were named as All-Americans, while 14 earned various honors from the GLIAC.

As well as cracking the top 10 once again, the men's swimming squad won its eighth straight GLIAC crown. Freshman standout Jeff Cooper was selected as the league's Swimmer of the Year, while teammates Mark VanderMey, also a freshman, and sophomore Steve Larson were six-time All-Americans. In all, the OU swimming program has had 58 individuals and 31 relay teams earn All-America laurels.

Women's swim coach Mary Ellen Wydan added a 12th-place finish to her sixth-place standing in her first year at the helm. The team won six dual meets for the second consecutive year, four against Division I opponents. Nancy Schermer matched the male swimmers with six All-America performances, while junior Kim Pogue added five similar efforts.

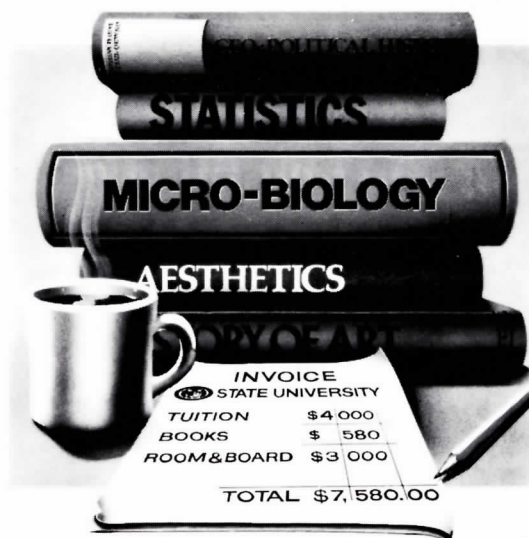
First-year mat coach Mike Ozga produced OU's best wrestling season nationally with a 19th-place finish in the NCAA Championships. Sophomore Jerry Umin finished fourth in the country in his weight class to become the school's first two-time All-American. Umin won his first 17 matches and ended the year at 20-3. Sophomore Dave Witgen also garnered All-America laurels, while fellow sophomore John Solomonson qualified for the nationals but did not place. Solomonson, Umin and yet another sophomore, Pat Stano, were GLIAC champions.

Soccer coach Gary Parsons took his squad to the NCAA tournament for the third straight year, but fell short of the final four finish of the prior two. Parsons has been named Mideast Coach of the Year for the last three years and has won 62 games in his four years at OU. Gray Haizel, Meally Freeman, Mike Vigh and Paul Larkin, all back this year, were All-Mideast choices a season ago.

Although men's and women's basketball didn't have the success or acclaim of other OU sports, their years should be considered successes. New men's coach Greg Kampe led OU to a 13-15 mark and has all five starters plus two top reserves back, topped by senior Chris Howze, now fourth on the all-time Pioneer scoring list with 1,346 points. The Lady Pioneers went 14-14 in a rebuilding year, and will be very young again this year. Brenda McLean, a three-time All-GLIAC pick and one of OU's all-time great women's basketball players is gone, but top sophomores Sarah Knuth, Margaret Boyle and Cherry Wilks return to lead the rebuilding process for coach Sue Kruszewski.

Success did strike women's volleyball again as the OU netters set yet another school win record. After setting a new mark with 22 the previous year, the Pioneers came home 32-12 to shatter the previous mark. Hurdle, 67-40 in three years, returns All-League choices Becca Wyatt and Mary Pike.

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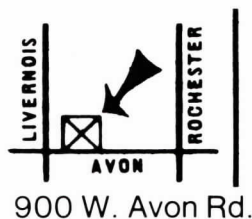
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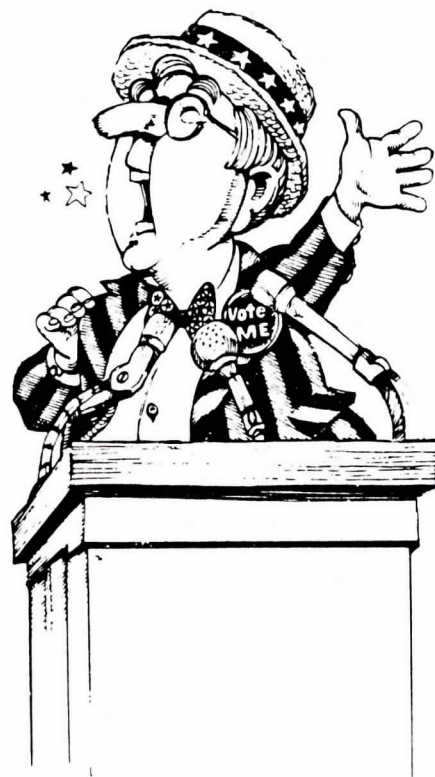
