JOHN DE CARLO-NAMED ASSISTANT CHANCELLOR FOR PERFORMING ARTS

Chancellor Varner announced the appointment today of John De Carlo, vice president for public services at Central Michigan University, to the newly created position of assistant chancellor for the performing arts. He will join us September 15.

The new position will bring under one roof the coordination, functions of finance, promotion and ticket sales for the Meadow Brook Music Festival and the Meadow Brook Theatre. "We have been trying to identify the best person to carry out this responsibility, and that search has led to John De Carlo," Varner commented in his formal announcement. "As manager of the Community Affairs Department of Chrysler Corp., De Carlo was responsible for the company's community affairs program and worked closely with the Detroit Symphony and the Grand Opera. In 1965 he worked extensively with Rinehart S. Bright, general manager of the Meadow Brook Festival, in promoting that year's program of concerts." "De Carlo has developed a unique knowledge of the role of performing arts in this community, a quality that is further enhanced by his three years of service as vice president at Central Michigan University. He knows both the arts and the University very well, and will be my personal representative in the development of these programs at Oakland University," Varner said.

De Carlo, 42, holds B.A. and J.D. degrees from Wayne State University and was a member of a private law firm in Detroit before joining Chrysler Corp. in 1954. At CMU, where he has served as vice president since 1966, he has been responsible for providing communication and liaison with governmental agencies, business and industry, educational institutions, alumni and other University offices. His office also assisted in obtaining funds for special research and assistance projects.

PREPARE TO BOIL

The heating plant--which, despite its name, also runs the central air-conditioning system--will be shut down August 19 and 20 to permit its connection with the Oakland Center expansion. There will be no air-conditioning in North Foundation, Dodge Hall, Kresge Library, the Health Center, Oakland Center, and Wilson Hall.

MANSION COSTS SPIRAL

An officer of Smith, Hinchman & Grylls Associates, the Detroit firm of architects, engineers, and planners that designed Meadow Brook Hall, commented last week that if this mansion were to be built today the basic construction cost would have zoomed from the late-1920 figure of \$3.5 million to about \$15.8 million.




