OU to host meeting on brain-based program

Oakland University's School of Education and Human Services (SEHS) is holding an information meeting on its Brain-Based Learning Program (BBLP) on Tuesday, May 18, at 4:15 p.m. at Lakeland High School, located at 1630 Bogie Lake Road in White Lake.

The BBLP is a three-course, graduate-level certificate program preparing educators and school administrators to use brain research and techniques to optimize student learning. Participants will gain comprehensive preparation in creating a high-challenge, low-threat classroom. Lesson design, creative delivery and memory techniques will be emphasized.

Jerry Evanski, an educator and consultant on brain research and classroom methods, is the program instructor. He has trained extensively in brain research application in educational settings with Eric Jensen, Richard Allen, and Geoffrey and Renatta Caine, experts in the field. Evanski presents seminars nationally on brain research, creativity, and school discipline.
