OU INSTITUTE WAS HOST TO CONFERENCE ON EYE DISEASES

The Institute of Biological Sciences at Oakland University was host to the annual "Conference on Biochemistry of the Eye" held Thursday, Oct. 11 through Sunday, Oct. 14 in Meadow Brook Hall.

The "by invitation only" conference has been held each year since World War II. It is a forum in which leading scientists can exchange ideas and discuss their ongoing ophthalmic research. The 1973 program is the first to be held at an institution outside the East Coast, V. Everett Kinsey, director of the Institute of Biological Sciences, said.

Topics include research on all forms of diseases of the eye, Kinsey said. A conference limitation (25 to 40 scientists) is held and an intimate setting chosen so that informal discussions can continue beyond the regular programs, he explained.

Forty persons have been invited to the 1973 conference. Participants include researchers from OU, Johns Hopkins University, Wayne State University, Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Mount Sinai School of Medicine, Columbia University, Yale University, the Wills Eye Hospital and Research Institute, and the National Eye Institute. French and German researchers are also represented.

FYES HITS 3,432; YEARLY FIGURE ESTIMATED AT 7,800

Oakland University's fall term fiscal year equated student (FYES) count is 3,432 students compared with 3,156 for fall, 1972. Headcount enrollments for the periods were reported previously at 9,600 for 1973 and 8,169 for 1972.

The FYES figure that determines the basis of support from the Legislature includes 520 graduate students compared with 383 for fall of 1973. The university is on target for a 7,800 student FYES figure for the 1973-74 fiscal year, President Donald D. O'Dowd said.

The Legislative appropriations base for Oakland was for 1973-74 7,325 FYES, with a contingency provision for growth. Oakland will receive an additional \$1,000 per full-time equivalent student above the base Legislature figure.

VILLAGE PROJECT IS SUBJECT OF OCT. 15-19 FUND DRIVE

Monday, Oct. 15 through Friday, Oct. 19, is the kick-off week for a fund raising drive for the Village Project. Special events are being held to raise the first \$10,000 for the project. If the fund drive is successful, President Donald D. O'Dowd has said he will seek outside funding for the project to equal the initial \$10,000 raised by the students.

The special programs include a Tuesday, Oct. 16 table tennis marathon in the Fireside Lounge of the Oakland Center, a Wednesday, Oct. 17 and Thursday, Oct. 18 sale of candied apples in the Oakland Center, and Friday, Oct. 19 open-stage production in the Abstinence of the OC. The open-stage production will be held at 8 p.m. to 12:00 midnight.

The first phase of the student-organized Village Project includes the renovation of the Barn Theater (which presently houses the Student Enterprise Theater); the conversion of the Grainery Barn (which is now used for storage) into a film barn for SEFS films and student-made films; the conversion of the pump house (which is now vacant) into a facility for print-making or photography. If licensing can be obtained, a pub will be installed in the basement of the Barn Theater. Beer and wine will be sold.

Future events include a Monday, Oct. 29 faculty-staff auction in the Fireside Lounge, a Friday, Nov. 2 Veterans Club beer party, and a 1950's sock hop in the OC sponsored by the residence halls. Throughout kick-off week costumed students will circulate throughout the campus selling "get villaged" buttons, and asking for donations to the project.
