Oakland University made national and international news July 18 when U.S. President George W. Bush and Poland President Aleksander Kwasniewski visited campus.

Both presidents as well as Governor John Engler spoke before a crowded arena in OU's Athletics Center as part of an official state visit, the second such visit during Bush's term.

The historic event, which marks the first time a sitting president from any country has ever visited the campus in an official capacity, placed the university in the national and international spotlight.
