THE HUNT FOR MID-OCTOBER

The 1992 Oakland University volleyball campaign will be an interesting one if only for this reason—16 of the team's first 19 playing dates, including eight of its first nine GLIAC matches, are away from the Lepley Sports Center. Conversely, eight of the last 10 dates, including the last seven league contests, will be played on OU's Rochester campus. By the time that home stretch starts on October 23, the Pioneers could be in a position to make a run at the GLIAC title, or be staggering toward another sixth place league finish.

"We have to survive and stay in the hunt until mid-October," 11th year head coach Bob Hurdle said. "We have just one conference home game until then. If we can stay close to the leaders by that point, we can be dangerous down the stretch."

Oakland was sixth in the GLIAC with a 6-10 mark last year, and ended 10-26 overall. The Pioneers lose only a pair of defensive specialists while returning 10 of last year's dozen letterwinners.

"We have the talent to be very successful," Hurdle said. "This team appears to be one of the most committed to winning that I have ever coached."

OU's offense will revolve around senior middleblocker Darlene Monroe. Monroe emerged as a force last year, and could be one of the GLIAC's premier players in 1992. She was among the league leaders in both blocking (3rd) and kills per game (8th) last season. She will be joined in the middle by sophomore Amy Ruprich. Ruprich became OU's number two person in the middle mid-way through last year, and was a candidate for Freshman of the Year honors. Pressing for playing time in the middle will be a pair of freshmen, Sandi Matteson and Karen Ill. Both come to OU with impressive credentials. Matteson, from Jackson Lumen Christi, was an All-State selection as a senior. Ill, from Millington, averaged over 3.5 kills per game as a senior.

The Pioneers are solid on the left side, with a trio of experienced players. Senior Julie Bardoni, an outstanding defensive player, and junior Cathy Workman, number two in kills for OU a year ago, are returning starters. Bardoni is Oakland's career leader in digs per game, and set a school mark with 25 in a match last season. Workman had 265 kills in 1991 and will be a major part of OU's offense. Melissa Hixon, also a junior, was second on the squad in blocking last season. Her two years of experience will provide OU with valuable outside depth. Another candidate for left side playing time is sophomore Andrea Czerwinski.

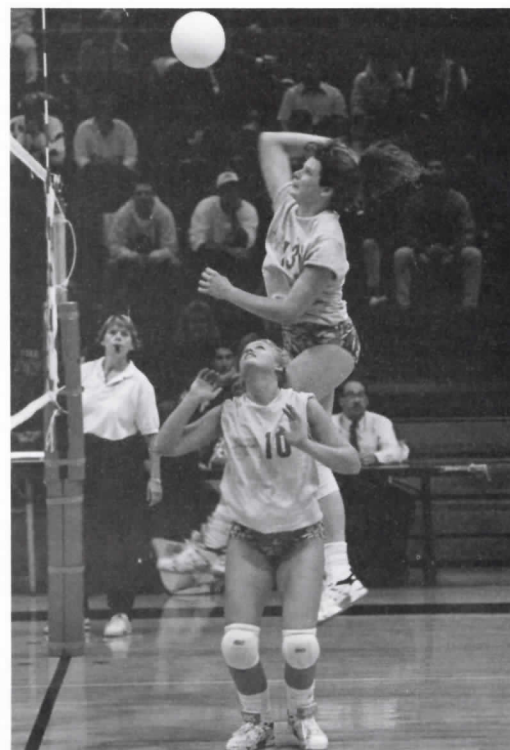
The right side is wide open again this year. A pair of sophomores, Kim Piwowarczyk and Donna Sowa, are the top contenders. Piwowarczyk saw the most playing time of any freshman last year, while Sowa, a redshirt sophomore, saw limited action. Matteson and Ill could both battle for playing time on the right side. Czerwinski could move over from the left side if necessary, or Tina Ronan, a senior could see action here.

The setter spot belongs again to junior Natalie Koan. Koan, sixth in the GLIAC in assists last season, had 1,118 overall last year. She also hit .302 with 141 kills, and had 55 blocks. Freshman Nicole Caputo will back up Koan. Caputo was a talented high school setter at Portage Central, earning All-Conference honors as a senior.

The schedule may be the main factor in OU's ability to contend for the GLIAC crown. The Pioneers host Wayne State on September 22 in their first home GLIAC match of the season. The next home GLIAC match is on October 24, seven road matches later. That may be too tough of a request for a relatively young squad to fulfill. OU will play in five tournaments again this season, including the first two weekends at Grand Valley State and Lewis. The Pioneers will also go to tourneys at Tampa and Indiana-Purdue at Ft. Wayne, and once again host the Pioneer Classic.

"We have the talent to finish anywhere from first to fifth in the GLIAC," Hurdle said. "The question is whether we can play night-in and night-out and keep the level of intensity we need. Another key for us is ball-handling. We were not a good ball-handling team last year and we must improve."

Keeping up the intensity during the first month and a half of almost nothing but travel will be the key to a successful campaign. If the Pioneers are still in contention when mid-October rolls around, they could be in position to make a run at the top of the GLIAC.

BOB HURDLE

Head Volleyball Coach



Now in his 11th season as the head volleyball coach at Oakland University, Bob Hurdle is hoping his team can return to the form that saw it win at least 25 matches a year from 1987-91. The Pioneers have won a GLIAC championship and have been a contender for an NCAA tournament bid in three of the last four years. His teams have succeeded off the court as well, with several of them earning academic laurels in the GLIAC.

"We have a quality group of athletes on the team this year," Hurdle said. "We have the talent to be successful. The question is whether or not we can do it every day."

Oakland ran up a 104-37 overall mark over those four seasons. Coach Hurdle now has a 221-134 record at OU in 10 seasons, having won 100 matches in his first four years. The Pioneers won the GLIAC championship in 1988, an ac-

complishment which earned Hurdle GLIAC Coach of the Year honors. They followed that up with a pair of second place endings behind Ferris State. OU had the best record in league games over those three seasons. Hurdle's 1985 unit won a school record 33 matches, was ranked as high as 13th nationally, and finished the regular season with a 7-1 mark and in a three-way tie for the league championship with Grand Valley State and Ferris State.

In his 10 years as OU coach, Hurdle has had 12 women win a total of 23 All-Conference honors. Erica Bauer was honored three times, as were Becca Wyatt and Mary Pike, the heart of Hurdle's first recruiting class. Tracey Jones, another three-time honoree, became the first Pioneer volleyball player to be selected to the All-Region team, earning the honor in 1987 and 1988. Holly Hatcher and Jennifer Zielinski have joined Jones as two-time All-Region honorees. Janice Van Velsen was the other Pioneer to earn All-Region honors.

Prior to coming to Oakland, Hurdle coached the volleyball team at Bloomfield Hills Andover High School. He earned a 96-36 mark in six seasons and guided Andover to a pair of Class A top ten finishes, a Greater Oakland Athletic League title, and two Southeastern Michigan Association crowns. A graduate of Ferris State University, Hurdle lives in West Bloomfield with his wife, Lois, and their son, Eric, and daughter, Natalie.



LINDA RUSAW

Assistant Coach

In her fourth season as an OU assistant coach is Linda Rusaw. Linda has spent the last 11 years as the head volleyball coach at her alma mater, Fenton High School, where she coached former OU players Tracey Jones and Kelly Williams, as well as current Pioneers Natalie Koan and Kim Piwowarczyk.

Rusaw has won district championships at Fenton all 11 of her years at the helm. Fenton also won five regional crowns during that time. The 1983 squad, with Jones as a sophomore, went 38-6 and advanced to the state finals. Fenton has been a state semi-finalist in three of the last four years, advancing to the championship match last year.

Linda played four years at Michigan Tech, where she was team MVP as a junior and senior and honorable mention AIAW All-State as a senior. She was selected as MTU's top female senior student-athlete in 1981.

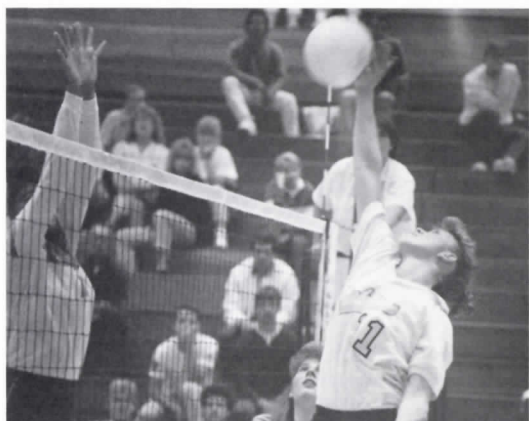
