CONTINUING EDUCATION: Audiences of more than 200 have been attending the Continuing Education-Village Women's Club morning series in Birmingham, History in the Making.

A second MSUO Conference for Parents and Teachers was held on February 18 to accommodate those who could not be accommodated at the first conference on February 4; it was also oversubscribed. On Saturday, 550 people attended the conference: "Developing Study Skills: How Parents Can Help."

SCHOLARSHIPS: The MSUO Foundation Scholarship Committee has set itself a goal of \$60,000 for this year, \$20,000 more than the group raised last year. It will provide for 160 scholarships. Last year's efforts provided awards for 130 MSUO students. In the 1959-60 school year, the group raised \$17,045 which made possible 53 scholarships. A similar group has been organized in Macomb County under the chairmanship of Mrs. Philip T. Mulligan, Mt. Clemens.
