Suha Kridli

A member of the OU faculty since 1999, Suha Kridli, assistant professor of nursing, is focusing her research on health care needs and practices among Arab ethnic groups both in the United States and abroad. Currently, she is principal investigator on a study of the incidence, course and treatment of diabetes among Arab-Americans, which is funded by Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan.

Kridli is author of numerous publications dealing with health care beliefs and practices, including family planning among Arabs and Chaldeans. She is a speaker of national and international reputation and made six presentations to distinguished audiences at home and abroad during 2002-03.

Kridli is well respected as an excellent teacher by students and colleagues alike. Students consistently express positive comments about her enthusiasm and knowledge as an educator. Colleagues have commented on her creative and sophisticated presentations of course materials. She has also demonstrated a strong service record to Oakland University, the School of Nursing and the nursing profession, including active membership on numerous university committees, and dedication and commitment to professional nursing organizations.
