Yale historian to discuss economic security on Feb. 1

Yale history professor and labor historian Jennifer Klein will visit Oakland University Monday, Feb. 1, to share her insight and expertise in a lecture titled "The Politics of Economic Security."

Sponsored by Oakland's Sociology Club and Department of Sociology and Anthropology, the talk will address national topics, including healthcare, Wall Street and the War on Terror.
