Request for Dismissal Appeal Time Period Change

The staff members at the Academic Skills Center suggested revising the time to submit a dismissal appeal from ten days to seven days to meet the needs of the students and update the process. This change in appeal time would allow the committee to receive the documentation sooner and meet earlier, thus being able to let dismissed students know their status and open up classes for current students to register, prior to the last day to add/drop courses. The Director of the Academic Skills Center (Dr. Malley) consulted with Dr. Awbrey and the Student Congress President and Vice President. The ASH committee members also unanimously supported this request. The UCUI supported this request and updated the 2011-12 undergraduate catalog.
