#### CO\*ED DORMS DEAD

As all of us expected the proposal to make Fitz and Anibal co-ed fell flat. Anibal will be all female and Fitz will remain an all male dorm. The reasons given for the final decision rested mainly on the structure dificiences of the two dorms in question. Gary Durst worked hard on this proposal and asked today if he had any comments he replied:

It is unfortunate that the opportunities for co-education will be so
restricted in the fall; however none
of the blame for the situation can
be placed upon the present administration. I have confidence that the
new administration is willing and
eager to work with the students to
make future decisions.

In other business the Dorm Council began proceedings on Women's key privileges. A proposal was introduced on the subject by the Dorm Council, Women's Judiciary Board, and the Women's Legislative board all working together. To be honest the prospects for such a situation in the fall look dim.

The Council also set up a comittee of Tom Volgy, Tom Tobias, Jay Korinek, Dean Appleton, Carol Wilson, and Dean Dutton to go over the proposed men's Judiciary Board. This committee will repost back to the Council on various proceedings.

The Council also took stion on House Committees. This plan calls for a small committee in each dormitory to work with and implement the Dorm Council. A complete proposal concerning this plan can be found in the back of this issue.


### WHAT SORT OF MAN READS FITZ BITZ

# Article V: House Councils

Section Is Establishment Each dormitory shall establish its own House Council of duly elected members, elected at the beginning of each trimester not more than one week after the election of the Dormitory Council representatives.

Section II: Membership

1 There shall be one member elected from each floor of the

Dormitory.

2 Additional members will be those members of the Dormitoby Council and the Dormitory Social Committee elected from that Dormitory. (The election of the members of the Dormitory Social Committee members shall be one member for 40 students or 1 per wing in Fitzgerald, Anibal and Pryale, and 1 per floor in Hill House and # Five.)

Section III: Duties The House Council shall discuss and legislate on the issues arising within that dormitory. All policy decisions must be ratified by the Dormitory Council. The Advisors of these House Councils shall be the Head Residents of each respective dormitory. Major changes shall be put to a referendum of the residents of that dormitory.

Section IV: Powers

1 The House Councils shall have the power to establish their own constitutions. These constitutions must be ratified by both the dormitory and the Dormitory Consil.

2 The House Councils shall have the power to establish an executive committee providing a Dormitory Council member be an

ex-officio member of this executive committee

3 The House Coun cils shall have the power to form subcommittees

es they deem necessary.

4 The House Councils shall have the power to make recommendations to the Dormitory Council through its Dormitory Council representatives.


## Dear Resident Student:


The Dormitory Council urges you to vote in favor of this proposal next Wednesday, August 4, before dinner.
