SUBJECT: | Annual Report - 1982-83

The University Research Committee had another busy year with the bulk of its time devoted to review of research proposals of various sorts submitted by members of the University faculty and by undergraduates.

A list of grants awarded during the year is appended.

In addition, the Committee tested a primary reviewer system for fellowship applications. The system seems to work and, with the addition of a written review statement made available on request to each proposer, should work very well, indeed.

We reviewed a set of Meadow Brook Research Conference proposals and, with the help of the Biomedical Research Support Grant Fund and Meadow Brook Hall, agreed to support two Meadow Brook Research Conferences next year. A proposal on the biochemistry of aging submitted by Professor Bandana Chatterjee and associates will be funded by BRSG and Meadow Brook Hall while the request submitted by Lyle Nordstrom will be funded by the Faculty Research Fund and the Hall.

During the year, the Committee established its own Research Excellence Award. A copy of the call for nominations for that award is enclosed.

Special note should be made of the continuing support of the Oakland University Alumni Association for the Undergraduate Research Grants Program. In recognition of that support and in response to requests from faculty and students, we will return next year to two closing dates per year for consideration of Undergraduate Research Proposals.

Further, the Committee will use a primary reviewer system so that undergraduates may meet with a Committee member for discussion of the research and the student's role in that research effort.

The Committee completed its work for the year by reviewing and approving, with some modification, program guidelines for 1983-84. In particular, the stipend level for faculty research fellowships will be increased from \$3,000 to \$3,600.
