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SIX CONCERTS WRAP UP A LONG COOL SUMMER

This is it: the final week of concerts in the 1969 Meadow Brook Festival and Special Events Series concerts in Baldwin Pavilion. The Festival features a special ninth-week program of the New York Philharmonic, under the direction of Czech conductor Karel Ancerl on Thursday and Friday and Seiji Ozawa on Saturday and Sunday. Soloists will be pianists Grant Johannesen and Andre Watts, respectively. Johannesen replaces the previously scheduled soloist, pianist Byron Janis, who had to cancel his appearance here because of an arm injury.

In the final concerts of the Special Events Series, the King Family will perform on Tuesday night, with WXYZ disk jockey Dick Purtan serving as emcee, and the New York Rock and Roll Ensemble and B. B. King (no relation to the King Family) will perform on Wednesday night.

CONVOCATION SPEAKER Gertrude M. White (English), a member of the charter faculty will give the principal address at this year's Convocation, for New Students and Parents, to be held at 8 p.m. Tuesday, September 2, in Baldwin Pavilion. The program will include remarks by Chancellor Varner and invocation and benediction by Rabbi Ernst J. Conrad.

MUSIC SCHOOL DIES The Meadow Brook Summer School of Music passed away last week at the age of five. Death was attributed to rising costs and declining enrollments. The school's Meadow Brook Chorus sang Verdi's Requiem Mass on July 26-27 as part of the Meadow Brook Festival. Other services will be private.
