Matilda R. Wilson Hall was named in bonor of its founder, who is today celebrating her 82nd birthday. The \$2.5 million classroom-office building is being constructed on a site just north of the University's original two structures—North and South Foundation Halls, constructed with funds provided by Mrs. Wilson and her late busband in 1957, along with their generous gift of the 1400-acre Meadow Brook Estate to establish this new institution.

Constructed with funds appropriated by the legislature, the Matilda R. Wilson Hall will provide classrooms and offices for some departments in the College of Arts and Sciences, the School of Education, language laboratories, and offices of Admissions, Placement and Dean of Students. It will include a lecture hall seating more than 600, and a new University art gallery.
