NATIONAL WHIG PARTY CAPTURES FIVE OF SEVEN SEATS. CHANCELLOR MAKES APPOINTMENTS.

Election results for the important committee on student affairs were made public last night. The national Whig party who first fielded a candidate in elections for the ill fated Comission on Student Life captured 5 of the 7 seats. Craig Barsuhn, first candidate to run under the banner in the twentieth century and now serving as the only elected Whig in the Mich. State legislature hailed the victory for his party.

Chancellor D. B. Varner in his message to the student body setting up this committee stated that it had become appearent that a major study of this important facet of the Univ. is now in order. Professor Thomas Volgy of the Political Science Department has been named as chairman.

SDS PLANS PROTEST MARCH

The Oakland University SDS yesterday announced plans to picket the federal building in Pontiac to protest American military maneuvers. The SMS is demanding that the United States pull all troops out of Iowa and cease the senseless and inhumane treatment of individuals. SDS leaflets show a picture of Mr. Walter Williger of Souix Falls who was injured during a joint army air force maneuver. He suffered a gash in the right leg when a paratrooper dropped a can of sardines from about 2500 feet. Mr. Williger is cited as an example in the inhumane treatment of civilians in Iowa. The Oakland Security Office immediately announced that one of its agents will be at the march incognito taking pictures of all participating.
