STUDENTS' RIGHTS

Once again the administration has sacrificed and compromised Oakland students for the greater glory of "the highest good of the university."

On Saturday, Oct. 16, the administration will, as they have done in the past, (mis)appropriate university facilities to accomodate outside groups. Much to the discomfiture of a large segment of the resident student body, the pending Writers' Conference will close the resident cafeteria to resident students for lunch. Instead, Mr. Ed will permit all residents to have a picnic on the athletic field. Should the present weather conditions persist, making the outing less than the sun-baked soiree it is supposed to be, food services has agreed to allow students to eat in the Sunset Room—all 750 of us. A second alternative in case of monsoon or blizard is to invite students to eat in their dormitory's crowded and none too sanitary lounge while buxom Bloomfield biddies recline in the resplendent luxury of the resident cafeteria.

The inconvenience caused by the residents' eviction from their dining hall, to be sure, is transient, and they will recover. But underlying the entire issue is a principle of importance.

To deny students the use of facilities for which they pay rent, for which they have a lease, constitutes unlawful eviction. To residents the university is home. And drafty though it be, and sometimes seem like an open-air torture chamber, they for the most part are devoted to it--the university is a part of them. It's not likely the Chancellor wouldn't feel imposed upon if the Board of Trustees decided they would like to requisition his stste-owned house for a week-end. And, contrary to what some administrators believe, the university administration cannot forever refuse to recognize that students are warm, feeling human beings who dislike being led to the altar as sacrifices for progress.
