2001 Heart Walk exceeds last year's totals

Oakland University faculty, staff, students and alumni this year raised \$30,263 to support the **American Heart Association's** September Heart Walk at Oakland, exceeding last year's OU total by \$7,763. The funds will support the association's work in heart disease and stroke research, education and community services.

In addition to pledges that OU community members collected, several fund-raising events before the Sept. 22 walk contributed to the \$30,263 total, including Dress Down Days, Pennies from the Heart, the Hole-In-One Challenge and the Hustle for the Heart Walk.

Dress-Down Days, when OU faculty and staff dressed casually for \$3 on Thursdays, raised \$492. A spare change drive raised \$375.

In exchange for donations, participants learned several versions of the Hustle dance on Sept. 6, raising \$207.

Pennies from the Heart raised \$216 by challenging residence hall students and OU student organizations to collect coins Sept. 9 through Sept. 15.

The Hole-in-One Challenge on Sept. 19 and 20 offered university community members a \$1 golf putt; a hole in one put them in a prize drawing. The prize for undergraduate students was four free credit hours donated by OU President Gary D. Russi. One student won that prize. Other winners received two packages for 18 holes of golf at Katke-Cousins Golf Course. The event raised \$250.

Russi extends his special thanks to all President's Cabinet members for fostering participation across campus. McIntosh served as OU's company leader for the Heart Walk. "It was a pleasure to work with the committee and the community on this important event," he said.
