Editorial Commentary Published in the Journal Heart Rhythm

Scientific journals sometimes publish editorial commentaries about important articles. In the November 2008 issue of **Heart Rhythm** Professor **Brad Roth**, of the **Department of Physics**, published an editorial titled "Long Versus Short Duration Fibrillation: What's the Difference?" (volume 5, pages 1607-1608). This commentary discussed a **paper** by Allred et al. (volume 5, pages 1599-1606) that analyzed electrical **defibrillation** of the heart. In particular, the study examined the difference between immediate defibrillation and defibrillation delayed by a few minutes, so that the heart becomes **ischemic**. Roth is a member of the **editorial board** of Heart Rhythm.
