Klemanski also played an important role in developing the assessment plans for the department independently and as a member of the Curriculum and Assessment Committee.

Perhaps his most important role, Klemanski eagerly mentors junior faculty by providing insight into the profession, helping prioritize tasks and guiding faculty in the tenure process. As chair of the University Assessment Committee, Klemanski assists departments in improving assessment plans and understanding the assessment process.

In addition to his university commitments, he serves as a member of the Rochester Hills Building Authority and the Rochester Hills Local Development Finance Authority.
