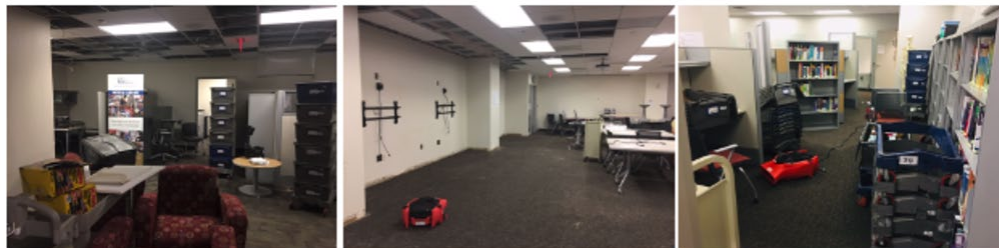

Nearly the entire first floor of Kresge Library, including all Medical Library spaces, were impacted. We are thrilled that restoration efforts are nearly complete and all of our spaces were able to reopen on February 25th. 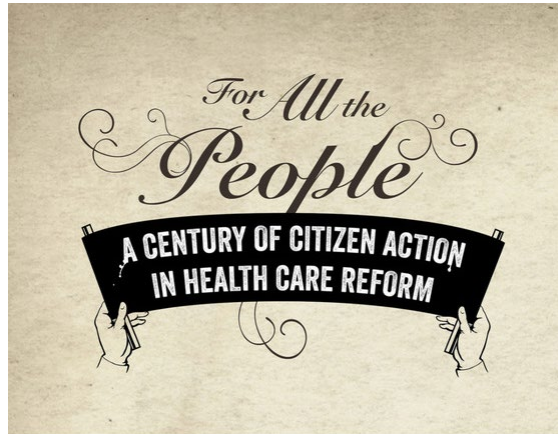
NLM Traveling Exhibit: For All the People
