Summer Reading Recommendations

Summer is a great time to get caught up on your reading! Check out the following:

The Public Physician: Practical Wisdom for Life in a Connected, Always-on World Dr. Bryan Vartabedian, a pediatric gastroenterologist and faculty member at Baylor College of Medicine, has written a "practical, hands-on guide to help doctors survive and thrive in a new age of connectivity and transparency." More, he has made this very helpful and insightful book **free** for download from the **iTunes** store. It's currently only available for iPads, but he hopes to have it available in PDF format soon.

For physicians new to social media, there are introductory chapters on what it means to be a "public physician" and specifics on blogging, twitter, and other forms of social media. For medical students and residents new to the practice of medicine, there are chapters on the importance of patient confidentiality, setting boundaries, and maintaining a professional persona while on social media.

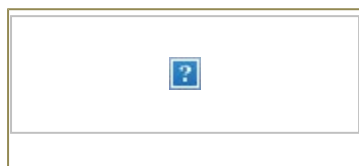

The LWW Health Library Oncology Collection includes a number of important oncology texts such as DeVita's Cancer, Wintrobe's Clinical Hematology, Harris Diseases of the Breast as well as guidelines and self-assessment questions. The trial runs until July 15.



The Biomedical & Life Sciences Collection is part of Henry Stewart Talks, a collection of online lectures. The collection includes more than 1,500 presentations on biochemistry; cancer, cell biology; diseases, disorders & treatments; drug discovery; genetics; immunology; methods; microbiology & virology; neurobiology; and pharmaceutical science. This new resource can be used in the classroom setting, in the lab, for research, as part of the curriculum, as a study or reference tool for students, or for personal interest. The trial runs through the end of December 2015.

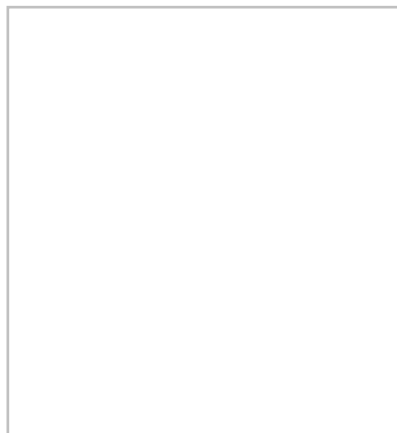
