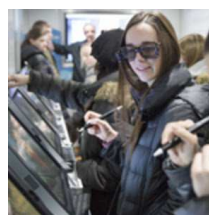

### RECIPES



#### Chicken Chili - Julie Chapie, ERL

- 3-4 chicken breasts cut into small chunks
- mushrooms, celery and onion - sliced and/or diced
- 2 packets of McCormicks white chicken chili mix
- 1 can diced tomatoes
- 1 can Black beans
- 1 can Dark red kidney beans
- 2 cans northern beans, drained
- 1 can fiesta corn, drained

Mix all ingredients together. Cook in crockpot on high for 5-6 hours.

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#### Dill Pickle Soup - Kristie Schult, ERL

- 8 cups chicken stock or broth
- 2 chicken bouillon cubes
- 2 medium carrots, coarsely grated
- 2 cups peeled and cubed potatoes
- 1 cup thinly sliced celery
- 5 coarsely grated dill pickles
- 1/2 cup milk (optional)
- 2 tbsp. flour (optional)
- 4-5 eggs
- 1 carton reduced-fat sour cream
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Finely chopped parsley (optional)
- Finely chopped fresh dill (optional)
- Pickle juice (optional)

In a large saucepan or soup pot with cover, bring chicken stock or broth and bouillon cubes to a boil. Add carrots, potatoes, and celery. Cook, covered, over low heat until potatoes are soft, about 10 minutes. Do not overcook, add pickles and continue cooking 15 minutes.

In a small bowl, beat milk and flour until completely smooth, stir a small amount of hot soup into flour mixture. Mix until smooth and return to soup pot, stirring until well combined. Bring soup to a boil, stirring frequently until soup is slightly thickened. Remove from heat.

In a medium bowl, beat egg with sour cream until smooth. Pour a large amount of hot soup into sour cream mixture - a small amount at a time and mix thoroughly, otherwise you get scrambled eggs. Return sour cream mixture to soup pot and stir until smooth. Keep sour cream warm, but do not boil after this point or egg/sour cream will curdle. Add salt and pepper to taste. Garnish with parsley and dill, if desired. Makes 10 servings.
