University set to 'Take Back the Night'

Oakland University's Police Department is sponsoring "Take Back the Night," a rally, march and speak-out on Wednesday, March 31, beginning at noon in the Oakland Center with a panel discussion about domestic violence.

Take Bake the Night is a nationally recognized event that provides a supportive environment for survivors of sexual assault while increasing public awareness. The event was started after a female student was sexually abused on a university campus. Since then, numerous universities and organizations have been working to raise awareness of sexual harassment.

This year's events at OU include a march around campus and a rally, which begin at 6 p.m. in front of Kresge Library, and the speak-out at 6:45 p.m. in the Oakland Center Banquet Rooms. The speak-out is an opportunity for survivors of sexual assault to tell their story and give encouragement to other survivors.

Take Back the Night ties together the end of Women's History Month and the beginning of National Sexual Assault Awareness Month, which starts in April.
