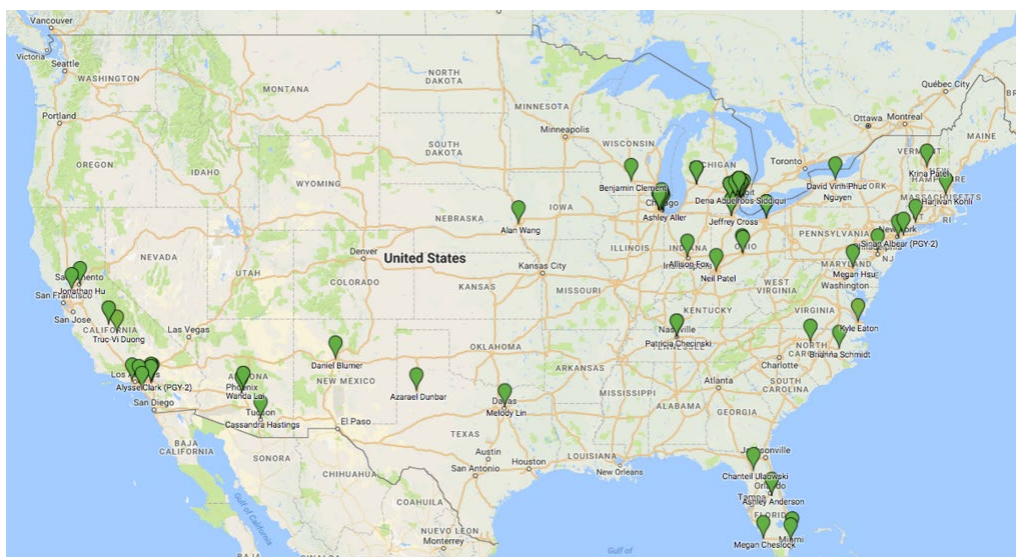

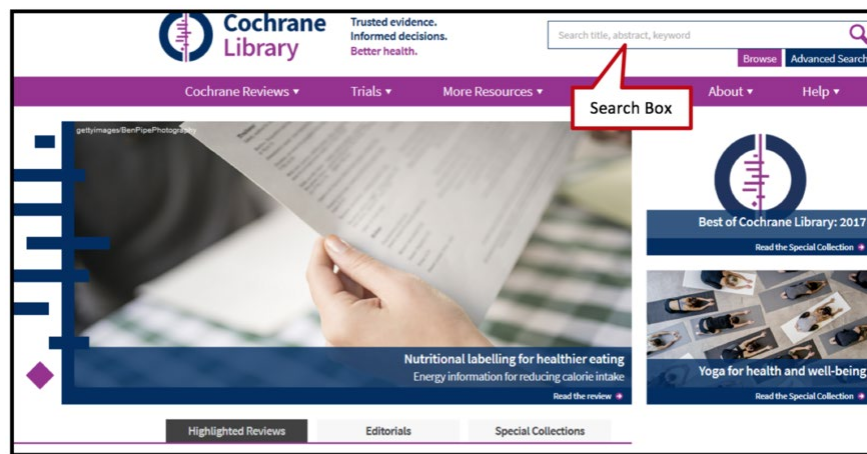

## Resource of the Month: Cochrane Library

**WHAT IS IT?** The [Cochrane Library](#) is a collection of six databases that contain high-quality, independent information for evidence-based practice, including the highly regarded Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews. Cochrane reviews are written by a non-profit international collaborative and are considered the gold standard for systematic reviews. Other databases in the Cochrane Library include the Cochrane Central Register of Controlled Trials and the Health Technology Assessment Database.

**HOW DO I ACCESS IT?** The link to Cochrane Library can be found on the library's [Databases](#) web page. It is also included on the library's online guide on [Evidence-Based Medicine Resources](#).



### FEATURES INCLUDE:

- Simple search box that searches across all databases as well as the option to use advanced search features
- Ability to browse by topic
- Results page that allows for easy identification of different types results
- Cochrane reviews are full-text and include clear grades of the evidence and implications for practice
- Recent Cochrane reviews include plain language summaries (often in multiple languages) for patient education
- Figures can be easily downloaded for teaching

**IS THERE AN APP FOR THAT?** Yes, there is a free Cochrane Library iPad edition that provides monthly summaries of selected reviews and podcasts. The app can be downloaded from iTunes or the App Store. You can also follow the Cochrane Library [Twitter](#) and [Facebook](#) for updates of monthly issues.

The Cochrane systematic reviews themselves can also be found through a PubMed search, but the added features included in the [Cochrane Library](#) database make it well worth your time in adding it to your EBM toolkit!
