**DRUGS LECTURE TODAY** Dr. Sidney Cohen, noted authority on drugs, will speak on "The Drug Dilemma" at 2:00 p.m. today (Monday) in Wilson Hall auditorium. His lecture will be followed by a panel discussion at 3 p.m. in the Gold Room. Panel members are Senate Minority Leader Sander Levin, Thomas Plunkett, Oakland County prosecuting attorney, and William Segesta, an attorney who specializes in defending persons charged with drug offenses. Dr. Cohen is chief administrator of the Center for Studies of Narcotics and Drug Abuse of the National Institute of Mental Health.

### LINDSAY RECALLS OU

New York Mayor John Lindsay recalls a talk he gave at OU during the 1965 spring Commencement in a feature article published in the October 25 *New Yorker*. Discussing his opposition to the war, Lindsay was quoted: "The first speech I made about getting out of the war in Vietnam was in April, 1965, shortly after we started bombing. I'll never forget it. It was at Oakland University in Michigan. I went there for an honorary degree and made the speech. It startled everybody. Then I never stopped."

### KLECKNER NAMED AIDE

The appointment of Keith R. Kleckner as assistant dean of engineering for graduate study has been approved by the MSU Board of Trustees. Kleckner is a graduate of Cornell University, where he taught until he was appointed associate professor of engineering at OU. His research work is in the areas of time-variable networks and distributed-parameter networks. In addition he has been organizing a communications laboratory in the School of Engineering under a National Science Foundation grant.

### HILDUM TO SPEAK

Donald Hildum (psychology) will deliver the first in a series of lectures on theoretical and applied linguistics at 1:00 p.m. Wednesday in the Gold Room. His talk will be entitled "Meaning: From Word-Stream to System." The lecture series is being sponsored by the committee on linguistics.
