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ASHKENAZY TO PLAY ALL FIVE BEETHOVEN CONCERTOS THIS WEEK

Vladimir Ashkenazy will perform the complete piano concertos of Beethoven at Meadow Brook Festival concerts this week as a tribute to the Beethoven Bicentennial. He will play the First and Second on Thursday, the Third and Fourth on Saturday, and the Fifth ("The Emperor") on Sunday. This last selection will be a repeat performance for Ashkenazy, who is an artist-in-residence again this summer for the Master Classes of the School of Performing Arts. He performed "The Emperor" during his first Festival appearance in 1967.

Each of the symphonic concerts this week will feature the Detroit Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Sixten Ehrling, and although the Sunday evening program is not listed formally as a "pops" concert, the regal Beethoven concerto is lightly balanced by four extremely popular works. Ehrling seems to have gathered together all the works he would offer on Halloween if the Festival ran through October: "Night on Bald Mountain" by Mussorgsky, "Funeral March of the Marionette" by Gounod, "Danse Macabre" by Saint-Saens, and "The Sorcerer's Apprentice" by Dukas.
